Good afternoon, Mark.

I wanted to bring you up to speed on the progress of our assessment activities at this site. We hope to have the CPT work completed before the end of June. We had an issue with the County Public Works Department over the boring permit (check amount), but that has been resolved, and we should have the permit any day now. We have yet to secure the encroachment permit for the off-site boring because the City requires the boring permit # on the encroachment permit application. If the permit issues all get resolved, we are scheduled perform the CPT work on June 28 and 29. I'll let you know if the schedule slips.

I would like to discuss the well screen interval issue with you when you have a chance. The groundwater elevations at this site fluctuate 3 to 5 feet in the year, which makes putting in wells with screen s limited to this interval problematic. There's a likelihood that screens this short will be either entirely submerged (possibly precluding seeing free product, if present) or dry during some portion of the year. I haven't had much experience with the multi-chamber setups, but I'm concerned that if for some reason the port gets plugged or fouled, we may loose the agility to sample an interval. I would like to discuss this with you further. Please call when you have some time to chat.

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
