No information regarding any tank associated with this pump has been located.

During a site visit, an UST (sic) was observed inside near the entrance of Space 9 (HLA 1990). Note: It is likely that HLA observed a fuel dispensing pump and pad, not a tank. The gasoline tank was connected to the nearby fuel pump located inside the building (HLA 1991).
