Conestoga-Rover and Associates (CRA) on behalf of Chevron Environmental Management Company (EMC) would like to request an extension for the Work Plan for Soil, Groundwater and Soil Vapor which was requested by Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) in their letter dated April 18, 2012 and due on July 27, 2012. The reason for this extension request is, the existing vapor probes were recently sampled and the soil vapor analytical results were just received. During the last groundwater monitoring event all wells were analyzed for dissolved metals, additional volatile organic compounds, semi-volatile organic compounds, and bio-parameters, these analytical results were also just received. We would like to take time to review this data and incorporate it into the work plan/site conceptual model. This will help identify any additional data gaps that might exist, which could be addressed by the work plan. The more data gaps we can address by the scope of work within the work plan, the more complete the Soil and Groundwater Report will be, which in turn will increase the quality of the Correction Action Plan. Therefore an extension of **September 7, 2012** for the submittal of the Work Plan for Soil, Groundwater and Soil Vapor is requested.
