The footprint of the new station building will cover a portion of the existing remediation compound. The existing compound will be razed and a new compound will be constructed a short distance to the north of the existing compound.

The existing remediation piping will be abandoned. New piping will be installed to facilitate continuous air diffusion in wells VW-1, VW-4, MW-6, and MW-13 in the future.

Paresh,

Per recent correspondence and our phone conversation earlier this week, this email serves to request approval from the Alameda County Environmental Health to properly abandon wells MW-1 and MW-8 at the subject site. The property is in the process of being divested. The new property owner is scheduled to raze and rebuild the Station building. The footprint of the new station building will cover existing monitor wells MW-1 and MW-8; therefore, these wells will need to be properly abandoned prior to commencement of construction activities. We were informed earlier today that construction is scheduled to start at the end of June.

Both wells MW-1 and MW-8 are considered upgradient wells from the source area. Only xylenes at low concentrations have historically been detected in ground water samples collected from these wells. The wells are currently gauged for depth to water semi-annually; however, as they have historically been relatively clean, they are not included in the ground-water sampling network. The remaining wells at the site are sufficient to determine ground-water gradient. Therefore, abandonment of the wells should not negatively impact future data collection.

Please let us know if you approve this request.
