Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) sent a Request for Property Access letter by certified mail on May 17, 2016. My intent, if I do not get any response from the property owners of 1955 Seminary Avenue property by the end of this month, is to move the case to closure. ACEH considers this the remaining data gap impeding closure under the State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCBs) Low Threat Underground Storage Tank Case Closure Policy (LTCP).

During that time an evaluation of the case file will be made to determine if a Site Cleanup Program (SCP- formerly Site Leaks, Investigations and Cleanup, aka SLIC) case will be opened to address the volatile organic compounds (VOCs) in groundwater.
