Dear Mr. Thompson, Li, Razi, and Haley:

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the case file for the above referenced fuel leak case including the recently submitted document entitled, "Revision of the February 6, 2006 Work Plan for Site DP793 Located at 4035 Park Blvd., Oakland, CA," dated September 24, 2008 and prepared on your behalf by Western Geo-Engineers. The September 24, 2008 Revised Work Plan proposes revisions to a February 6, 2006 work plan entitled, "Work Plan for 4035 Park Boulevard, Oakland, CA 94602."

The February 6, 2006 work plan proposed four tasks: 1) the connection of receptor trench wells T1 and T2 to a newly installed treatment compound; 2) destruction of on-site wells MW1, RS2, and RS6; 3) excavation of contaminated soil; and 4) further delineation of the extent of contamination west of Brighton Avenue. To date, only tasks 2 and 3 have been completed. Tasks 1 and 4 have not been implemented in accordance with ACEH requests. As discussed in previous ACEH correspondence dated November 6, 2006, April 12, 2007, and February 1, 2008, this site remains out of compliance with ACEH directives.

The September 24, 2008 Revised Work Plan proposes reducing the volume of contaminated soil to be excavated from approximately 2,100 tons to 1,100 tons in order to reduce costs. As discussed in the technical comments below, we do not concur with the proposed excavation and dewatering in the September 24, 2008 Revised Work Plan. We request that you implement the proposed excavation in the February 6, 2006 Work Plan or submit a Revised Work Plan that addresses the technical comments below.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

1. Proposed Excavation. The September 24, 2008 Revised Work Plan proposes excavation of approximately half of the contaminated soil within the outline of the proposed excavation area. The proposed excavation will consist of trenches that transect a portion of the excavation area. Contaminated soils will apparently be left in place within irregular areas

between the trenches. We do not concur with this proposal since the excavation will not meet the objective of removing the source of contamination. Soil analytical data indicates that most of the mass of contaminated soil is less than 25 to 30 feet bgs. The proposed excavation must focus on removal of contaminant mass rather than groundwater extraction. Leaving approximately half of the residual contamination in place within the area of excavation is not acceptable. We request that you implement the excavation as previously proposed or submit a revised work plan that directly addresses residual soil contamination.

2. Task 4. As discussed in previous correspondence, we concur with the proposal to implement Task 4. Please present documentation of implementation of Task 4 in the report requested below.

TECHNICAL REPORT REQUEST

Please submit technical reports to Alameda County Environmental Health (Attention: Jerry Wickham), according to the following schedule:

- December 8, 2008 Revised Work Plan or Implementation of Proposed Excavation in February 6, 2008 Work Plan
- February 6, 2009 Intercept Trench Construction

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

ACEH's Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program FTP site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) Geotracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the Geotracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanup (SLIC) sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in Geotracker (in PDF format). Please visit the SWRCB website for more information on these requirements (http://www.swrcb.ca.gov/ust/cleanup/electronic_reporting).

PERJURY STATEMENT

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I declare, under penalty of perjury, that the information and/or recommendations contained in the attached document or report is true and correct to the best of my knowledge." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this case.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6735, 6835, and 7835.1) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately registered or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this case meet this requirement.

UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

Please note that delays in investigation, later reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.

AGENCY OVERSIGHT

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.

SUBJECT: Electronic Report Upload (ftp) Instructions

Effective January 31, 2006, the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the county's ftp site. Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

REQUIREMENTS

Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection. (Please do not submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.)

It is preferable that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.

Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.

Do not password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the
document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password.
 Documents with password protection will not be accepted.

Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer

monitor

Reports must be named and saved using the following naming convention:

RO#_Report Name_Year-Month-Date (e.g., RO#5555_WorkPlan_2005-06-14)

A separate copy of the tables in the document should be submitted by e-mail to your Caseworker in Excel format.
 These are for use by assigned Caseworker only.

Submission Instructions
