Thanks for getting back to me. It is my understanding that Nucor purchased, from the bankruptcy courts, just the physical assets of the Seattle, WA plant, Kankakee, Ill, Birmingham Alabama plant, the Jackson Miss. Plant and the Memphis, TN plant. These were all pure asset purchases from the bankruptcy court. Nucor did not buy Birmingham Steel nor did they assume any liabilities. Certain local operating contracts were transferred if they were necessary to keep the assets operating(utility contracts etc.). There has never been any connection between Nucor and the Barbary Coast site. I hope this helps.
