Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the fuel leak case file for the above referenced site. Shell owned and operated a service station at 2350 Harrison Street in Oakland until 1977. Shell obtained tank removal permits from the City of Oakland and apparently removed four underground storage tanks (USTs) in March 1977; however, no documentation of the tank removal has been found. Mr. Richard Burge purchased the property from Shell on May 31, 1977 after the USTs were removed. During the installation of two light poles in November 1992, lubricating oil was detected in soils at concentrations up to 3,200 milligrams per kilogram (mg/kg). Total petroleum hydrocarbons as gasoline (TPHg) were detected in soils from four additional soil borings advanced on March 4, 1993. TPH as lubricating oil and TPHg were detected in soil from the 1993 borings at concentrations up to 7,900 and 620 mg/kg, respectively. No groundwater sampling has been conducted at the site to date.

ACEH previously requested that Shell prepare a work plan for site investigation in correspondence dated May 21, 2001. We request that you prepare a Work Plan by January 22, 2008 to investigate the extent of soil and groundwater contamination at the site.

It is my assumption that Equiva Services is aware and will assume environmental responsibility for the investigation of the referenced former Shell Oil service station. Briefly, this site was a Shell gasoline station up to 1977 at which time the gasoline (and other?) underground tanks were removed. Later investigation found that Shell Oil Co. was issued a permit by the City of Oakland to remove 1-5000, 1-8000, 1-10000 and 1-550 gallon tank. No documentation exists pertaining to the tank removals. The site is currently a 7-11 retail food facility. Apparently, during the installation of two light poles in November 1992 at this site, petroleum contaminated soils were encountered. At that time, the developer, Burge Development Company contracted Groundwater Technology, Inc. (GTI) to collect samples from the two stockpiles generated. Up to 3200 ppm TPH as lubricating oil (GC-FID), 89 ppm TPH as gasoline and 0.24, 0.31, 0.22, 2 ppm BTEX, respectively were detected in these soil samples. No map exists which indicates the location of these two locations. Based upon these results, our office requested additional investigation. Burge Development had GTI prepare a work plan. On March 4, 1993, four additional borings were advanced by GTI. Up to 7900 ppm TPH as lubricating oil and 620 ppm TPH as gasoline was identified in the soil samples. Unfortunately, no BTEX analysis was performed nor were any water samples collected.

Burge Development never operated underground tanks at this site since their purchase in 1977. Because of the historical use of fuel tanks at this site, Shell Oil was named as a responsible party. Mr. Thomas Maher, Senior Manager, Environmental Claims Management was informed of this request to participate in the investigation and he replied in his May 25, 1999 letter to Ms. Eva Chu of this office, copy of letter enclosed. As you will note in his letter, he questioned that appropriate sampling of the initial samples. The contractor may have biased the soil samples since they were not environmental consultants. That may have been the case, however, the additional investigation performed by GTI was done in a professional manner and these results confirm a minimally a release of TPHg and TPHmo. In Mr. Maher's letter, he states that Shell is "certainly willing to perform a subsurface investigation at 2350 Harrison St. if a more reliable indication that a release of product occurred during Shell's occupancy is now available or is discovered in the future." Therefore, it appears that Shell should now proceed with this investigation.

I am the case worker and have completed review of the file for the above referenced site. Records indicate that Shell Oil had owned the subject property and sold it to Mr. Richard Burge in March 1977. At that time the fuel underground storage tanks (USTs) were also removed.

The site is currently a 7-11 retail food facility. In November 1992 two light poles were installed in the planter area of the site. Hydrocarbon odors were detected by the construction crew. In March 1993 soil samples were collected at "7.5'bgs and analyzed for various petroleum hydrocarbon constituents. There was no analysis for BTEX constituents. Up to 7,900ppm TPH as lubricating oil and 620ppm TPH as gasoline were identified. Groundwater was encountered at "8'bgs but a water sample was not collected.

I contacted Mr. Tom Maher, of Shell's Environmental Claims Department, but he was not able to locate any information regarding the removal of the former USTs at the subject site. Therefore, additional investigations are required at this time to determine the extent and severity of soil and groundwater contamination at this site. A work plan for this phase of the investigation is due to this office by **November 2, 1998.**

Finally, if we find confirmation of test results at #4, you suggested installing a monitor well to check on groundwater.

You also asked that the drums containing dirt from test holes be removed from the site in a correct manner.

As you are aware our contractual obligation requires our company to remove all normal spoils that are excavated during construction. Normal meaning a common or natural condition. I have been informed by Sandra Lindsey of Groundwater Technology Inc. that their company has been hired by the owner of the property, Mr. Richard Burge of Burge Development Company, to monitor and dispose of the contaminated spoils. The current status to our knowledge is that all the spoils, consisting of approximately 5 1/2 yards, are currently stored in 21 steel drums on the job site waiting for removal. We at this time will process the bill for work that was done at the store, and any additional cost we incurred due to the nature of the work. 
