The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) has required since March 1, 1997 that this agency use this case closure letter for all UST leak sites. We are also transmitting to you the enclosed case closure summary. These documents confirm the completion of the investigation and cleanup of the reported release at this site.

SITE INVESTIGATION AND CLEANUP SUMMARY

Please be advised that the following conditions exist at the site:

- Up to 120 milligrams per liter (mg/l) Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons as Gasoline (TPH-G) and 6.0 mg/l Benzene, among other fuel compounds, are present in groundwater beneath the site.
- A reported 1410 pounds of Oxygen Releasing Compounds (ORC) were injected into 33 boreholes emplaced about the former UST dispenser area to facilitate biodegradation of residual fuel compounds.

I am in receipt of the P&D Environmental (P&D) workplan dated May 1, 2000 that proposes the injection of oxygen-releasing compounds (ORC) into 33 borings in locations surrounding exploratory boring B6. Boring B6 is located in proximity to the area believed to be the former location of the dispenser(s) that served the former underground storage tanks (UST) on the former Cottage Bakery site. This workplan was reviewed in consultation with Mr. Chuck Headlee, San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB).

The cited P&D ORC workplan is accepted as submitted.

I am in receipt of the P&D Environmental (P&D) subsurface investigation report dated February 29, 2000. This report chronicles the installation of a total of fourteen exploratory borings about the former underground storage tank (UST) complex and dispenser area of the former Cottage Bakery site. Soil and groundwater samples were collected from each boring. Each borehole was also logged during advancement and encountered sediment lithologies described.

The data presented in the cited P&D report appear to demonstrate the presence of a spatially-limited plume of gasoline and diesel-range contaminants in shallow groundwater and soil in the area most proximal to the reported location of the former fuel dispenser. The data also appear to indicate the plume mass is centered near boring B6. Soil impacts appear substantially limited to the capillary zone.

P&D recommends two optional courses of action that would, if either is implemented, move this case towards final case closure. Both courses reflect my recent conversations about this case, using data from the initial phase of P&D's investigation, with Mr. Chuck Headlee of the Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay region (RWQCB). The two options available to you to move this case towards accelerated case closure are: 1) a deed notification that would place a moratorium on any future use of shallow groundwater at the site, or 2) implementing some form of remediation that would effectively reduce latent hydrocarbon concentrations (HC), and, in essence, mass, in the subsurface. P&D recommends the use of oxygen releasing compounds (ORC) for this purpose, an option that could be acceptable if it can be shown to be an effective technology for known site conditions, and mass balance calculations demonstrate appropriate HC mass reductions.

Attached please find a map showing site landmarks and recent boring locations, as well as tabulated sampling results from assessment work that occurred in December 1999. I am sending you this info preliminarily to a meeting that I hope to have with you regarding how this case should be handled. A property transfer is on hold until the regulatory issues are fully ironed out.

History

This once contiguous site operated as the Cottage Bakery from the 1950s through the mid-1980s. Several structures, including warehouses and raw materials (e.g., flour) storage "tanks", were present at the site during the operation of the bakery.

Two USTs also served the bakery operations during their tenure at the site; one storing gasoline and the other diesel fuel. Both tanks were removed under subsequent ownership in October 1986. Samples collected under the USTs were "ND" for targeted compounds (TPH-G and D). BTEX were not sought. No samples appear to have been collected from below product piping or dispenser(s).

The June 16, 1999 ENSR Phase I and follow-up July 15, 1999 Phase II assessment reports have been reviewed. The ENSR reports were financed by a prospective purchaser of portions of this once contiguous site, the home of Cottage Bakery between 1955 and 1985.

Records presented in the ENSR reports and from other sources indicate as many as two (2) motor vehicle fuel underground storage tanks (UST) were present at the site and served the Cottage Bakery operations. Both USTs appear to have been removed in October 1986 during the approximate two year period when the property was owned by S.B. Development Company of Castro Valley.

The record reflects that at some point the property was split into parcels, and the parcels sold to a series of others over the years. One parcel (ASN 416-30-29-2) is currently owned by the Anthony R. Marques Trust and has been developed into a public storage facility. The remaining parcels (ASN 416-80-1-2, -2-2, and -3-2) are owned by Ms. Chang and Mr. Chiu. Other than a warehouse structure at the southeastern portion of the site, only building foundations and asphalt cover comprise the bulk of these parcels.

In preparation for the purchase of the Chang/Chú parcels, ENSR performed the Phase I/II assessments for the prospective purchasers. ENSR contracted for a geophysical survey and subsequently advanced a series of seven Geoprobe® soil borings about the site. Initially it was believed following record review that a single 10,000 gallon UST had been the only tank at the site historically. Three of the borings, GP-1,-2, and -4, were advanced in an area where it was believed the sole UST and dispenser were located. Up to 16,000 mg/kg total petroleum hydrocarbons as gasoline (TPH-G), 3900 mg/kg TPH-diesel (TPH-D), and 31 mg/kg benzene, among other fuel constituents, were discovered in soil at the 15 foot depth in boring GP-1. Further, 5500 ug/l TPH-G, 3300 ug/l TPH-D, and 3.3 ug/l benzene, among others, were found in shallow ground water sampled from boring GP-4. These data indicate an unauthorized fuel release had occurred at this site.

Subsequent to publishing and distribution of the ENSR reports, additional records were discovered and a reevaluation of recent and historic land surveys made. These new data indicate that there was not one, but two USTs at the site. Further, it appeared that one of the two tanks was located on the parcel now owned by the Marques Trust. Consequently, current owners of both properties (Chang/Chu and Marques Trust) were named by this office on 11/03/99 as "responsible parties", consistent with provisions of California UST law and regulations.

At this time, pursuant to California Code of Regulations §2725, you are required to perform a soil and water investigation (SWI). Please have your "lead" consultant submit a SWI work plan for review. This work plan shall present a comprehensive approach and include, among other elements, the following:

- Plans to assess the source areas (e.g., USTs, piping and dispenser areas, etc.) and extent
 of soil and groundwater impacts away from the source(s)
- Sample points within each target area shall be placed using a grid system
- ☐ Include soil sampling intervals to facilitate the appropriate Risk-Based Corrective Action (RBCA) evaluation following the ASTM RBCA E1739-95 framework
- ☐ Target compounds shall include diesel and gasoline fuel components (TPH-G, -D, BTEX)

This SWI work plan is due for submittal within 45 days of the date of this letter.





This letter summarizes ENSR's findings concerning the location of a former underground storage tank (UST) associated with the above-referenced site. ENSR received and reviewed information provided by Mr. Kent Woodell of KTW Properties, Inc., under a cover letter, dated September 22, 1999. It should be noted that ENSR had obtained a photocopy of the 1956 Building Inspection Map and 1955 Tank Permit (provided in Mr. Woodell's letter) during our due diligence assessment activities and used this information during the Phase I and Limited Phase II assessment activities conducted onsite. ENSR revisited the information obtained to date concerning this property at the request of Evelyn Hubel of Public Storage, Inc. Based on ENSR's review of this information and dimensions provided in the above-referenced documents, it is ENSR's opinion that the former UST fuel dispenser (a portion of the UST system) was located on the subject site. Based on property boundary information and dimensions provided in the above-referenced permit documents, the former UST appears to have been located along the western subject property boundary.

Based on limited Phase II environmental assessment activities conducted by ENSR at the subject site, soil and groundwater beneath the subject site have been impacted by petroleum hydrocarbons. Additional assessment would be required to confirm the source and location of the release(s) and to determine the extent of impacts to soil and groundwater.

It is my opinion that the ENSR Environmental Report # 5555-439-230 on the referenced property is in error. Location of the former underground storage tank is incorrectly shown and is NOT, nor was NOT on the subject property. I have reached these conclusions based upon the below listed items:

- 1. Original (reduced) copy of Survey Map (note location of tank)
- 2. Copy of 1955 Building Inspection Map when tank installed
- 3. Copy of 1955 Tank Permit
- 4. Reduced copy of Current Survey
- 5. Copy of ENSR 6/14/99 Site Plan
- 6. Copy of 6/30/99 County Notice of Responsibility Letter
- 7. Copy of modified Scott Seery Plat Map

Wilson Chiu, Owner, had always maintained there were no tanks on his property. ENSR prepared Phase I and partial Phase II and prepared #5 without locating tank. Upon receipt of #5 and the ENSR Report, owner went to Alameda County, researched records, and came up with #'s 1, 2, and 3.

As shown on #4, Survey, the Grove Way frontage is 235 feet. As shown on #1, old Survey, the Grove Way frontage was 369.65 feet. The tank location was roughly drawn in on #1 and it conforms with the #2, Permit Map.

Page 2 Various Addresses September 22, 1999

Apparently, in 1985 or so, the western 135 feet was sold off and Castro Valley Storage building constructed on it. Its address is 2489 Grove Way. The tank would have been about in the center of the new building. It is my opinion that ENSR's research for Phase I was either incorrect or incomplete, their subsurface metal tank exploration unnecessary and misdirected, and the ENSR Site Plan in error. Note, ENSR shows the tank directly under the major existing storm drain lines.

This combination of errors has caused a considerable (costly) delay in the permitting process of the project; has resulted in the issuance of a #6, Notice of Responsibility letter to the wrong party, Chiu/Chang; my personal expenditure of some 35 to 40 hours to figure out the problem; the expiration of the Buyer's Contract; and delay in <u>substantial</u> earnest money monthly payments to the owners.

Certainly ENSR (apparently) discovered an environmental problem, but has also created an expensive delay/liability situation. It is my recommendation that ENSR prepare, at their expense, a corrected work plan to take all necessary steps to allow appropriate evaluation of the scope of the contamination and immediately process same through the Governmental Agency(s). We have taken steps to reinstate the Purchase Contract.

By copy of this letter, I request Alameda County Health Care Services (Scott Seery) rescind #6, Notice of Responsibility, and assign it to the adjacent property owner. ENSR should coordinate and head up the program to either get an appropriate closure/clearance letter or other program which will allow the close of escrow and commencement of construction without risk or liability to either buyer or seller.

I anxiously await comment/direction from all concerned.

Please provide to this agency, within twenty (20) calendar days of receipt of this notice, a complete mailing list of all current record owners of fee title to the site. If the list of current record owners of fee title to the site changes, you must notify the local agency of the change within 20 calendar days from when you are notified of the change.

If you are the sole landowner, please indicate that on the landowner list form. The following notice requirements do not apply to responsible parties who are the sole landowner for the site.

RE: Double Wall Tanks, Annulus Venting Requirements (MH9061)

Dear Mr. Lessig:

I am writing you this letter at the request of Xerxes Corporation to clarify our requirements for venting the annulus of double wall underground tanks. If the annulus is intended for atmospheric operation with manual or electronic detotion methods, the stand pipe supplied with these devices would provide adequate venting of the annular cavity. If the tank were intended for a pressure or vacuum monitoring system, obviously an annular vent would defeat the purpose of such a system.

With a double well tank, venting of the primary tank is required to allow for satisfactory filling and withdrawal procedures. Since the temperature of a buried tank remains reasonably constant, we see no reason why the annulus (which is neither used for filling or withdrawal) should be vented. If a tank is intended for either pressure or vacuum monitoring of the annulus, we would require that the maximum monitoring pressure or vacuum be marked at the opening, and would anticipate an initial test of the system at a pressure equal to twice that rating.
