PRE-APPROVAL OF CORRECTIVE ACTION COSTS, Claim No. 6414 Former Housing Authority, 1916 Webster Street, Alameda, CA

I have reviewed your April 16, 1997 request for pre-approval of costs for destruction of six groundwater monitoring wells and disposal of drums containing purged groundwater and destruction wastes. In response to the April 3, 1997 "no further action" letter from the Alameda County Local Oversight Program, your consultant (ENSR Corporation, formerly Fugro Geo-Environmental, Inc.) prepared an April 15, 1997 proposal for the well destruction and drum disposal. Your letter and all associated documents, along with this letter, will be placed in your claim file for future reference.

Based on the information provided and the USTCF's Cost Guidelines, costs have been preapproved for \$7,235. (Prior to this point, the total amount eligible for reimbursement through request No. 8 is \$180,736.97) With the following provisions costs in the table on page 2 have been pre-approved for reimbursement:

- The work is acceptable and approved by the Alameda County Local Oversight Program and the San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board.
- The actual scope of work performed and costs are consistent with this pre-approval and the 4/15/97 cost proposal by ENSR.
- It is my opinion that it is unnecessary to obtain three bids for this scope of work; the USTCF's three bid requirement is waived for this scope of work only.
- If a different scope of work or change order becomes necessary, then the claimant must request pre-approval of costs for the new scope of work. Please complete the enclosed blank form when submitting future pre-approvals. The pre-approval form must be signed by the claimant.
- All future costs for corrective action must be pre approved in writing by USTCF staff.
- Although I have referred to ENSR's proposal, please be aware that you will be entering into a private contract. In other words, the State of California cannot compel you to sign any specific contract. This letter pre-approves costs as presented by ENSR for destructing six existing monitoring wells by over-drilling and for drum disposal as approved by Alameda County for implementing the 4/15/97 cost proposal.

Be aware that this pre-approval does not constitute a decision on reimbursement. All reasonable and necessary corrective action costs for work directed and approved by the County will be eligible for reimbursement. Also, remember that it is still necessary to submit the actual cost of the work as explained in the Reimbursement Request Instructions to confirm that the costs are consistent with this pre-approval before you will be reimbursed. To make this easier, be sure that your consultant and subcontractors prepare invoices to match the format of the 4/15/97 bid and provides reasonable explanations for any changes made in the scope of work or increases in costs. When the invoices are submitted you must include copies of all:

- subcontractor invoices
- technical reports, and
- applicable correspondence from the County.

I also want to remind you that the USTCF's regulations require that you obtain at least three bids, or a bid waiver from USTCF staff, from qualified firms for all necessary corrective action work. Legislation governing the USTCF requires that we assist you in procuring contractors and consultants. If you need any assistance in contracting for corrective action work, don't hesitate to call me.

Lastly, I wish to inform you that Senate Bill 562 went into effect on January 1, 1997. One of the provisions of SB 562 states that: any "owner or operator that has a tank case who believes that the owner's or operator's corrective action plan for the site has been satisfactorily implemented, but where closure has not been granted, may petition the fund manager for a review of the case."

This letter is to confirm our understanding of the Alameda County Health Services Agency's (ACHSA) position on the handling of soil containing lead at the above-referenced site. Twining's understanding was developed from our telephone conversations over the last week.

BACKGROUND

As discussed in our telephone conversations, Twining has drilled several shallow soil borings in the area of a former City of Alameda Bureau of Electricity storage yard at the southwest corner of Atlantic Avenue and Constitution Way, in Alameda. Soil samples were collected from the surface to approximately 4.5 feet below site grade. Analytical results for lead ranged from less than 10 mg/kg to 310 mg/kg.

TWINING'S UNDERSTANDING OF THE ACHSA POSITION

Based on our conversations, it is our understanding that the ACHSA will not require special handling for the soil on site during soil moving operations. This is would be based on the proposed site use as a commercial retail facility. We also understand that use would be restricted to either beneath building pads or asphalt. In addition, we understand that the soil could also be used in landscaped areas as long as at least three feet of soil without elevated concentrations of lead will cap the soil with elevated lead concentrations.

CLOSING

As we discussed, Twining is preparing a summary of our assessment for lead in soil on site. We will forward the project summary to you when completed. Twining appreciates your help in this

I have completed review of Fugro West, Inc's September 1996 Soil Remediation and Closure Report for the above referenced site. This report summarized activities to excavate remaining hydrocarbon-impacted soil and results of the recent groundwater sampling event.

Approximately 75 cy of impacted soil was excavated in August 1996. Confirmatory soil samples were collected from the sidewalls (from 2' to 4.5'bgs) and pit bottom (5' bgs). The highest concentrations of TPHg (460 ppm) and benzene (6.2 ppm) remain in the soil which extend beneath the maintenance building. The majority of the hydrocarbon-impacted soil has been removed from the area of the former UST. Residual TPHg and benzene in soil is limited in extent and are currently covered by the concrete slab of the existing building and or is under the paved parking lot.

Under current conditions/land use, impact to human health and the environment from the remaining impacted soils is low. However, if the property is sold, it is proposed that a commercial mall be constructed at the site. Therefore, it is prudent to conduct a RBCA Tier 2 risk analysis to determine what human health risk exists should building(s) be built over the residual hydrocarbons in soil and groundwater. If low or no risk exists, then site closure will be recommended by this agency.



I have reviewed your request, received on January 16, 1996, for pre-approval of corrective action costs; I will place these documents in your file for future reference. I have included another copy of the "Cost Pre-Approval Request" form; you can obtain additional copies of the form from me.

With the following provisions, the actual costs of conducting the work proposed in the Fugro-West, Inc., December 28, 1995 proposal and approved by the Alameda County Health Care Services Agency (County) will be eligible for reimbursement. The total cost pre-approved for reimbursement is \$66,824; see the table below for a breakdown of the costs. (The total amount previously eligible through reimbursement request no. 6 for your site is \$143,664.)

I have completed review of your January 17, 1996 letter which requested case closure for the above referenced site. The premise for your request was based on recommendations from the recent study by the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL) and by Mr. Christopher Stevens of the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB).

The SWRCB has provided guidance and recommendations that "oversight agencies proceed aggressively to close low risk soil only cases. For cases affecting low risk groundwater we recommend that active remediation be replaced with monitoring to determine if the fuel leak plume is stable."

The above referenced site is currently detecting up to 1,400 ppb benzene in groundwater (which is at approximately 4.6' bgs and within silty sand sediments). Soil analytical results from a soil boring advanced inside the warehouse building had exhibited up to 27 ppm benzene at 3 to 4.5' bgs. Based on current site conditions, this site is not considered "low risk". Therefore, additional investigations, as recommended below, to address human health risk due to residual contaminants must be performed before the site will be evaluated for possible closure.

A risk analysis using the American Society of Testing and Materials' (ASTM) Risk-Based Corrective Action (RBCA) standard should be performed to determine risk and clean up levels to protect human health. Or, the limited, residual hydrocarbonimpacted soil along the exterior wall and under the warehouse building may be excavated, thus removing potential ongoing source which may continue to degrade groundwater quality. has been approved by this agency in a letter dated January 10, 1996.

Recently, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) shared a letter with me concerning a report that had been submitted by Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL). A copy of this letter is attached.

You agreed in your letter, received on September 21, 1995, that our site is currently under "NAZ." You advised that "no further soil/source removal is required at this time," but that we need to continue groundwater monitoring. It was our understanding that, under this option, groundwater monitoring was likely to continue for at least two years before the site could be considered for closure. With redevelopment of the site a possibility, the Housing Authority decided to consider another option that you proposed, excavation of the remaining impacted soil.

You recently approved a work plan involving excavation of the remaining impacted soil at the site. We have requested SWRCB pre-approval for the costs to implement this work plan. If obtained, we will proceed with immediate implementation. At the same time, the Housing Authority believes that its site poses low risk and now may be eligible for immediate closure according to LLNL's recommendations to the SWRCB. According to Underground Storage Tank reviewer Christopher Stevens, LLNL has recommended and SWRCB has approved much quicker closure of such low-risk sites and, in <u>most cases</u>, immediate closure. He also recommended that the Housing Authority request site closure based on these new recommendations.

Based on LLNL's recommendations to SWRCB, the Housing Authority requests your consideration of our site at 1916 Webster Street for immediate closure. The Housing Authority would also like assurance that, if closure is granted, the Authority will be in compliance with California water quality standards and any other environmental laws or regulations that may apply to this site related to the underground gasoline storage tank and the leakage that resulted.

LAWRENCE LIVERMORE NATIONAL LABORATORY (LLNL) REPORT ON LEAKING UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK (UST) CLEANUP

In October 1995, the LLNL presented to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) its final report, Recommendations to Improve the Cleanup Process for California's Leaking Underground Fuel Tanks. The LLNL team found that the impacts to the environment from leaking USTs were not as severe as we once thought. The report also presents a convincing argument that passive bioremediation should be considered as the primary remediation tool in most cases once the fuel leak source has been removed.

The LLNL report has also been presented to the SWRCB's SB 1764 Advisory Committee which will, in turn, provide recommendations to the SWRCB by the end of January 1996. The SWRCB may choose to implement recommendations from the LLNL report and the SB 1764 Advisory Committee through revisions to SWRCB Resolution 92-49 in early 1996.

In the interim and in light of the findings and recommendations in the LLNL report, we believe cleanup oversight agencies should proceed aggressively to close <u>low risk</u> soil only cases. For cases affecting <u>low risk</u> groundwater (for instance, shallow groundwater with maximum depth to water less than 50 feet and no drinking water wells screened in the shallow groundwater zone within 250 feet of the leak) we recommend that active remediation be replaced with monitoring to determine if the fuel leak plume is stable. Obviously good judgment is required in all of these decisions. However, that judgment should now include knowledge provided by the LLNL report.

What I propose to you is not in any way inconsistent with existing policies or regulations. However, it does represent a major departure from how we have viewed the threat from leaking USTs. This guidance is consistent with the results of a discussion of this subject among the State Board Chair and Regional Board Chairs on December 5, 1995. I have completed review of Fugro West's 2nd Quarter 1995 Groundwater Monitoring Report for the above referenced site. At this time, sampling of well MW-6 may be discontinued. Wells MW-1, MW-2, and MW-3 may be sampled annually in the month of March. The remaining wells, MW-4 and MW-5 should be sampled quarterly. Of course, quarterly monitoring reports are still due within 60 days upon completion of field work.

For your information, "non-attainment zones" (NAZ) is a management tool implemented if it appears the contaminant plume has stabilized, source removal has occurred, and there exists no economically feasible technology for cleanup. This site essentially is currently under NAZ with the reduction in sampling frequency. And, no further soil/source removal is required at this time. Continued sampling of wells MW-4 and 5 will verify 1) the effectiveness of source removal; 2) if contaminants left beneath the building will not leach and continue to impact groundwater quality; and 3) if natural bioattenuation is occurring. Once this has been demonstrated, the case will be reviewed for possible site closure.

The concept of ground water "non-attainment zones (NAZ)" has just recently come to my attention. There is a possibility that our site at 1916 Webster Street may be a candidate for site closure using this methodology. While you were on vacation, I discussed the possibility with Susan Hugo. She advised us to write this letter asking for your consideration of using the NAZ methodology for the 1916 Webster Street site.

We would appreciate your opinion of the viability of using the NAZ method to achieve site closure and your advice on how best to proceed if it is a possibility. Our site appears to meet the criteria necessary to be considered for the NAZ methodology. We hope you will consider these factors:

- 1. The most recent ground water monitoring report submitted by Fugro (August 1995) indicates that there is no free product at the site. There appears to be no significant risk of migration.
- 2. Only one property is involved -- the plume does not cross property boundaries.
- 3. Source removal has occurred. Tank removal and soil excavation have been completed.
- 4. Soil vapor extraction is a costly cleanup method and the likelihood of achieving drinking water standards are poor especially where there is clay in the soil, such as exists at our site.

Fugro West, Inc. has agreed to suspend remediation activities at the site pending your decision on this issue. If you instruct us to proceed with the soil vapor extraction pilot test, however, we are prepared to proceed immediately under our existing contract with Fugro.

In July 1986, a 280-gallon underground storage tank (UST), used to store gasoline, was removed from the above site. Contaminated soil was observed in the tank pit, and consequently, approximately 130 cubic yards of soil was excavated and aerated on site. Subsequent to the excavation, confirmatory soil samples were collected from the north and west walls of the excavation. Analysis of these soil samples identified 3,700 parts per million (ppm) Motor Fuel from the north-wall soil sample.

To this date, seven soil borings, B-1 through B-7, and three monitoring wells, MW-1 through MW-3, have been drilled at the site. Soil samples collected from B-7, located north of the excavation, identified 1,300 ppm Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons as gasoline and 130 ppm benzene. Additionally, groundwater grab samples were collected from the above soil borings. Analysis of these groundwater samples identified Motor Fuel and benzene contamination from B-1 (37,000 parts per billion (ppb) Motor Fuel, 5,100 ppb benzene), B-4 (200 ppb benzene), and B-5 (20,000 ppb Motor Fuel, 1,260 ppb benzene).

Groundwater sampling of the three on-site monitoring wells has only identified minor concentrations of benzene at 3.7 ppb from Well MW-2. However, due to the elevated concentrations of contaminants identified in the grab samples collected from the soil borings, it appears that further work needs to be conducted on delineating the contaminant plume beneath the site. For example, the groundwater sample collected from Boring B-4, located east of

the former UST, identified 200 ppb benzene, yet previous efforts were not made to delineate the plume in this easterly direction.

You are required to submit a work plan to this office within 45 days of the date of this letter, which will address methods to further delineate the contaminant plume underneath the site. Additionally, you are required to address the soil contamination problem at the northern end of the excavation area.

Additionally, it has been noted that previous samples collected from the site were not analyzed for lead. Since it is unknown whether the former UST held leaded or unleaded gasoline, any further soil and groundwater samples that may be collected from the site should be analyzed for lead.

Please be advised that monitoring reports are to be submitted quarterly until this site qualifies for final RWQCB "sign-off". The last monitoring report this office received for the site was dated November 1991. Such quarterly reports are due the first day of the second month of each subsequent quarter. Hence, we are presently missing reports documenting activities occurring the 4th quarter of 1991 and 1st quarter of 1992; the 1992 2nd quarter report is additionally due August 1.

Due to the uncertainty in the groundwater gradient variations in Alameda, groundwater elevations are to be measured monthly for 12 consecutive months and then quarterly thereafter. Groundwater gradient maps must be developed for each water level monitoring event occurring at the site. This groundwater elevation information may be included in the quarterly reports submitted to this office.

The required investigations must adhere to the technical requirements outlined in the Regional Water Quality Control Board's Staff Recommendations for the Initial Evaluation and Investigation of Underground Tanks, the State Water Board's LUFT manual, and be consistent with requirements set forth in Article 11 of Title 23, California Code of Regulations. A report documenting the results from work performed is due to this office within 45 days of completion of field activities. These additional investigations will be used to determine an appropriate course of action to remediate the site, if deemed necessary.

Please be advised that this is a formal request for technical reports pursuant to California Water Code Section 13267 (b). Any extension of the stated deadlines, or modifications of the required tasks, must be confirmed in writing by either this agency or RWQCB.


