Dear Mr. Siblev:

This department has recently reviewed the Work Plan for Soil and Groundwater Assessment dated January 25, 1996, prepared and submitted by Aqua Science Engineers, Inc. for the above referenced site.

The proposed work plan includes the drilling of one boring within ten feet of the former tanks in the anticipated downgradient direction and the collection of soil and grab water samples. The work plan is acceptable to this agency with the condition that polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs) be included as target analyte in both soil and groundwater samples if TPH diesel is detected in the samples.

Please notify this office at least 72 hours in advance of the work plan implementation so a site visit can be arranged by a representative from this office.

All reports and proposals must be submitted under seal of a California Registered Geologist or Registered Civil Engineer with a statement of qualifications for each lead professional involved with the project.

Dear Mr. Sibley:

This department has recently reviewed the case file concerning the removal of the two underground storage tanks (1-10,000 gallon diesel and 1 - 8000 gallon gasoline) at the referenced site. We are also in receipt of your letter dated November 22, 1995 requesting for case closure of the subject site.

The two underground storage tanks were removed in May 26, 1993. Soil samples collected following the removal of the tanks showed contamination up to 1,600 ppm TPH diesel. The grab groundwater sample collected from the bottom of the excavation found up to 3,300 ppb TPH diesel. Heavy soil staining and sheen in the groundwater were observed during the removal activities.

On June 7, 1993, overexcavation was conducted to remove the localized diesel contamination found in the south wall of the pit. Confirmation soil samples were collected and showed no detectable concentration of TPH gasoline, TPH diesel, benzene, ethyl benzene, xylene and toluene.

Based on the review of all the data submitted for the referenced site, the threat to water quality must be investigated before the site can be recommended for closure. You may address this issue by advancing a boring within ten feet of the former tanks in the verified downgradient direction. At a minimum, one soil sample must be collected preferably at the soil/ groundwater interface. Additionally, a groundwater sample shall be collected from the boring using appropriate sampling techniques. Both the soil and groundwater samples must be analyzed for TPH gasoline, TPH diesel, benzene, ethyl benzene, toluene, and xylene.

Please submit a brief work plan addressing all the items mentioned above no later than February 21, 1996.

All reports and proposals must be submitted under seal of a California Registered Geologist or Registered Civil Engineer with a statement of qualifications for each lead professional involved with the project.

## FINAL NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Mr. J. Sibley:

Our records indicate that there are underground tank(s) at your site at the above facility. You were notified of this situation months ago and have not taken the appropriate action as described below.

In accordance with the California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Chapter 3, Subchapter 16 Underground Tank Regulations you must perform one of the following actions:

- 1. Submit a tank closure plan to this Department as required by Article 7, 2670, forms available from this office, or
- 2. Apply for a permit as required by Article 10, 2710. Permit applications Part A and B are available from this office.

Please note that section 25299 of the California Health and Safety Code states that any operator or owner of an undergound storage tank is liable for a civil penalty of not less than five hundred dollars or more than five thousand dollars per day for failure to obtain a permit, or failing to properly close an undergound storage tank, as required by section 25298.
