Dear Mr. Fries:

I am in receipt of the document dated March 14, 1995 submitted by Aqua Science Engineers, Inc., for the referenced property, which included investigative reports by Exceltech, and Kaldveer The report from Exceltech included the laboratory Associates. results of soil samples collected during the removal of an underground storage tank from the referenced property. Based on the review of all pertaining documents by this Department, the additional work is required for a characterization of the soil and water contamination in the subject property.

1. Though the laboratory analysis of soil sample #1 collected from the former underground storage tank pit during the removal operations of the tank did not indicate the presence of any significant contamination, subsequent soil samples collected during the installation of MW-4 indicated significant concentrations of BTEX at 3.5 feet and 6 feet. Also, there are no indications of water samples being collected downgradient to the former oil water separator.

Hence, two additional soil borings will be required; one at the downgradient side of the former oil-water separator, and one at the downgradient end of the former underground storage tank (as close as possible to MW-4) to check if BTEX is still present in the soil. Soil samples at 5 feet intervals, and a grab water sample should be collected from each boring.

2. Two more quarters of groundwater monitoring should be performed for all 4 monitoring wells, MW-1 to MW-4.

A workplan should be submitted to this Department within 60 days addressing the listed issues. If you have any questions, call me at (510) 567-6764.

Dear Mr. Fries:

The California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal-EPA), Department of Toxic Substance Control (DTSC), has been investigating the presence of several priority pollutants, primarily volatile organic compounds (VOC), heavy metals, and nitrates, in soil and ground water occurring in the central San Leandro area since approximately 1986. Currently, six sites are being investigated with Cal-EPA lead or oversight, as follows:

- o 139th Avenue site (Cal-EPA lead)
- o Factor Avenue site (Cal-EPA lead)
- Singer-Friden site (Cal-EPA lead)
- Caterpillar site (Cal-EPA oversight)
- Hudson ICS (Cal-EPA oversight)
- o Staefa Control System Inc./2481 Washington Avenue (Cal-EPA oversight)

Because of similar contamination found at these sites, DTSC suspects that a larger, regional contamination problem exists that requires further investigation. Presently, DTSC is conducting a Regional Hydrology and Contamination Study in Central San Leandro. The purposes of this study include, among other elements:

- o defining as far as possible the known vertical and horizontal extent of contamination in the area;
- o identifying existing public and/or private wells that can be used by DTSC for monitoring purposes;
- instituting coordinated sampling; and,
- o defining the hydrogeology of the area.

The intent of the DTSC study is to develop the best possible data on the extent of contamination while realizing no unnecessary expenditure of public funds. Following the presentation of the study's final report, DTSC will develop a work plan for conducting further study, targeting potential source areas and "hot spots" identified during the course of this phase of the investigation.

The DTSC has requested Alameda County's assistance in developing this study and report by coordinating ground water sampling efforts for those sites under county lead. To meet this goal, you are requested, on a volunteer basis, to supplement the sampling slated to occur at your site(s), listed below, during January - March 1992, in addition to those sampling/monitoring activities already required, as follows:

- 1) Collect and analyze ground water samples from at least one well for VOCs (EPA Method 624, or 601/602). The well sampled for this task is to be chosen based upon its potential for detection of VOCs relative to other wells on-site, i.e., its proximity downgradient of a former waste oil or solvent underground storage tank, VOCs identified in prior analyses, etc.
- Present this data, along with other requisite sampling/monitoring data, in the 1992 first quarter report. <u>Submit a copy of this report directly to the DTSC</u>, at the following address:

Dear Ms. Simons:

Kaldveer Associates have provided us with a copy of the above mentioned report that includes a summary of the site's history, and a description of soil testing and contaminated soil removal. The report contains a recommendation that the open excavation on site be filled with clean backfill (which has been done), and a statement that there is no threat to ground water quality.

We believe that that ground water quality could have been impacted at this site, and that a ground water investigation should be conducted. Please provide us with with a plan for ground water investigation near the site of the underground oil trap, and any available groundwater data that was obtained in connection with the removal of the underground tank in 1987.

We need a "deposit-refund" of \$432.00, paid by check made out to "Alameda County," to cover the County's expenses on this case. Our current rate is \$67.00 per hour. Any amount remaining when the case is closed will be returned to you.
