This letter, prepared by Pacific Environmental Group, Inc. (PACIFIC) on behalf of Chevron U.S.A. Products Company (Chevron), documents the completion of well abandonment activities at the site referenced above. This work was performed in accordance with in your letter, dated February 14, 1996, and PACIFIC's Work Plan, dated February 15, 1996. Permits for well abandonment were approved by, and are on file at, Zone 7 Water Agency.

Monitoring Wells MW-1, MW-2 and MW-3 were abandoned on February 21 and 22, 1996 by drilling out each well to total depth. The resulting boreholes were backfilled from the bottom up with neat cement to grade, in accordance with Bulletin 74-90, California Well Standards, California Department of Water Resources, June 1991. Drilling was performed by a state-licensed well driller and observed by a PACIFIC geologist.

Well debris resulting from the abandonment activities will be temporarily stockpiled onsite, pending laboratory analysis and will be removed from the site by Chevron's disposal contractor, IWM, and disposed of at an appropriate landfill.

Our office has reviewed your Soil Investigation and Excavation Report received in our office on February 14, 1992, and the Fax transmittal dated February 19, 1992 that was prepared by Riedel Environmental Services. Those reports represent that excavations were performed in areas of known contamination until non-detectable was obtained in all confirmatory samples with the exception of one sample that revealed 15 PPM of Oil and Grease. In one former gas tank location confirmatory samples could not be taken because the pit was excavated to bedrock. Previous investigations identified up to 985 PPM and 25 PPM of Oil and Grease in the soil and water respectively. With the current data and information available to this office, further excavation is not required at this time. However, if conditions change, you maybe required to perform further excavation.

The August-10, 1990 Tri-Regional Board Staff Recommendations for Preliminary Evaluation and Investigation of Underground Tank Sites requires the installation of monitoring wells at the site. Riedel Environmental has proposed installation of three monitoring wells.

Based upon all the current data and information reviewed by this office, and the current guidelines of the Regional Board, should these wells be monitored on a monthly basis for groundwater elevation, and groundwater is sampled on a quarterly basis for a

period of one year during a year with normal rainfall, and the groundwater contaminates are non-detectable, it can be reasonablely anticipated that this office will recommend site closure to the Regional Water Quality Control Board.

I was quite pleased with your speedy preparation of the draft letter for Mr. Ali I received via FAX Friday afternoon and your follow-up telephone call of the same day. The clarity and conciseness of the draft was appropriate to the situation. Thank you.

The only changes I recommend are those set out below---which primarily take the form of even more brevity. Please review and advise. I should have the Riedel proposal to you by Wednesday.

"Dur office has received and reviewed all reports submitted by Riedel Environmental Engineering regarding the above noted property. It appears all tests agreed upon were conducted and, excepting one sample of Oil and Grease found at bedrock measuring 13 PPM, all contaminated soil has been removed from the site.

As a final measuring of testing you have proposed through Riedel Environmental Engineering consistent with the Tri-Regional Board Staff Recommendation of Underground Tank Sites the installation of monitoring wells at the site as follows:

Based upon current data and the Tri-Regional Guidelines noted above, after monitoring these wells monthly for groundwater elevations and samples resulting in "non--detectable" (ND) contamination quarterly during a twelve month period of normal rainfall, it can be reasonably anticipated this office would recommend to the Regional Water Guality Control Board site closure."

Based upon all the current data and information reviewed by this office, and the current guidelines of the Regional Board, should these wells be monitored on a monthly basis for groundwater elevation, and groundwater is sampled on a quarterly basis for a period of one year during a year with normal rainfall, and the groundwater contaminates are non-detectable, it can be reasonablely anticipated that this office will recommend site closure to the Regional Water Quality Control Board.

Riedel Environmental Services, Inc. (RES) respectfully requests, on behalf of California Pacific Investments, a recommendation to the Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) for closure at the former Standard Station located at 5775 Broadway in Oakland. We believe that the February 1992 Soil Investigation and Excavation Report you have received, and additional data included in this letter provides all the information necessary for you to make a recommendation to the RWQCB at this time.

Soil sample analyses gathered during investigation and excavation work at the site indicates that all elevated levels of petroleum hydrocarbons have been removed from soil at the site. Work conducted during two previous investigations include excavation near the former waste oil tank with two confirmatory samples indicating no detectable fuel hydrocarbon or oil and grease in the soil. Also, petroleum hydrocarbons were not detected in hand auger and trench soil samples in the areas of former underground storage tanks, pump islands and product lines. During the most recent RES investigation in November 1991, six soil borings were drilled and soil samples collected and analyed every 5 feet. The boring locations were selected in conference with you based on a map of former service station structures provided by Chevron U.S.A. Oil and grease (O&G) was the only hydrocarbon detected in four of the six borings. Soil in the area of the four borings was excavated until oil and grease was not detected in side and bottom confirmatory samples (except one bottom sample that contained 15 ppm O&G, please see the February 1992 RES report for further explanation).



We believe that soil at the site poses no risk to groundwater, that installation of a monitoring well is not warranted, and that the site should be granted closure with no further action required for the following reasons.

- o Excavation to bedrock (4 to 15 feet below surface) during November and December 1991 revealed no groundwater on site. Therefore groundwater does not exist in the soil above bedrock under the site on a year-round basis.
- Soils at the site consist of low-estimated permeability clay, clayey sand and sandy clay. Oil and grease has a relatively low solubility in water and tends to adsorb to soil, particularly clay. Therefore the O&G-bearing soil was unlikely to have acted as an efficient source of contamination to water that infiltrated through the soils before they were removed from the subsurface.
- To investigate potential impact of the soil on groundwater that may have infiltrated through the soils at 5755 Broadway, RES sampled on February 18, 1992, with the permission of Shell Oil, the monitoring well S3 located at the Shell station apparently downgradient of the site. Two groundwater samples were collected from S3 and sent under chain-of-custody to a state certified hazardous waste laboratory to be analyzed for O&G. O&G was not detected in either sample, indicating that groundwater downgradient of the excavation has not been impacted by O&G. A site location map, a site map of the Shell station indicating groundwater flow direction and the location of S3, and the laboratory report are included as attachments.
- of If, in future, the seasonal high groundwater should rise to a level above the bedrock on all or part of the site, the soil on site is not a potential source of petroleum hydrocarbons because the soils with elevated petroleum hydrocarbon concentrations have been removed from the subsurface. On February 4, 1992 you met with me on site. The largest excavation, pit B-2, was still open and contained water at the bottom. I believe this water was rain and surface runoff from recent storms. However, you expressed the concern that the water may reflect a seasonal high groundwater level. Therefore on February 18, 1992, RES collected a water sample from Pit B-2 and sent it with the samples from well S3 for analysis of O&G. O&G was not detected. The laboratory report is attached.

We would like to thank you for the attention you have devoted to the environmental work performed by Riedel Environmental Services at 5775 Broadway, and for taking the time to meet with me on two previous occasions to discuss the progress of the environmental work. We understand that this site is not considered "high priority" by the Alameda County Health Services Agency. For this reason, we believe a timely decision by you on the future of this site would be beneficial to the community.



Time is of the essence to California Pacific Investments for future development of the site. California Pacific Investments is under deadline from the lending institution for the environmental work at the site to be resolved. For this reason it is critical to California Pacific Investments to receive a decision by The Alameda County Health Services Agency so that review by the RWQCB may proceed. With your decision that no additional environmental work is required, plans for development may continue while RWQCB is reviewing the site.

Representatives of California Pacific Investments and RES will meet with you at 11:00 a.m. on February 20, 1992 to discuss your decision with you.





This letter outlines the soil boring and excavation work performed by Riedel Environmental Services, Inc. (RES) at the former Chevron Station at 5775 Broadway, Oakland as well as stockpile sampling, backfill and disposal to take place. Dates of excavation and perimeter outlines are included in Figure 1.

Excavation was conducted on November 15, 1991. Pits B-1, B-3, and B-6 were excavated to bedrock. Pit B-2 was excavated to 10 feet below surface. Soil samples were collected from the sides of pits B-1, B-2, and B-3 just above bedrock. The sample depths are indicated in the laboratory reports. The soil sample collected at 10 feet below the surface from boring B-2 which oil and grease was not detected is considered a bottom confirmatory sample for that pit. The upper 5 feet of soil from pits B-1 and B-6 were stockpiled separately as "clean" soil based on soil boring sample results.

Excavation pit B-6 is located in a former tank pit that was set into bedrock 11 feet below the surface. During excavation of pit B-6 soil with gasoline odor was noted between 8 and 11 feet below the surface. All of the soil was removed from the tank pit and stockpiled. As pit B-6 is recessed in bedrock it was not possible to collect confirmatory soil samples.

On November 21, 1991, additional excavation was conducted along sides of B-1, B-2 and B-3 where oil and grease was detected in the previous excavation soil samples. The laboratory reports indicate that oil and grease was not detected in soil samples from pits B-1 and B-3. Oil and grease was detected in samples of the north, south, and west sides of pit B-2 in concentrations under 20 mg/kg. A small "veinlet" of dark, presumably oil and grease bearing soil was observed on the south side of pit B-2 but was not sampled.

The future plans for the site include the backfilling of B-1,B-3, and B-6, and removal of contaminated stockpiles to an appropriate landfill. This will create space, permitting the continued excavation of B-2 until concentrations of oil and grease are not detectable.

Because of the shallow depth to bedrock on site there is no permanent water table associated with it. Although infiltrating rainwater passes along the top of the bedrock at times during the year, the amount of moisture associated with the soil at depth is insufficient

to justify the installation of a groundwater monitoring well. With this in mind RES requests, on behalf of California Pacific Investments (CPI), a letter of approval confirming mitigation of environmental problems pending completion of the work described above and confirmation that a groundwater monitoring well is unnecessary.

DEFINITIONS

Hazardous Substances. Any substance listed in Section 6382 of the Labor Code or in Section 25316 of the Health and Safety Code. This includes: gasoline, diesel fuel, all industrial solvents, pesticides, herbicides and fumigants. If the material must be carried by a registered hauler, disposed of at a hazardous waste site, is explosive, generates pressure due to heat or decomposition or would harm humans or wildlife; it is considered a hazardous substance.

Underground Storage Tank. Means any one or combination of tanks, including pipes connected thereto, which is used for the storage of hazardous substances and which is substantially or totally beneath the surface of the ground.
