Dear Mr. Puckett, Ms. Bellini, and Mr. Fine:

In correspondence dated September 14, 2006, Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) notified you that your fuel leak case had been reviewed by ACEH and California Regional Water Quality Control Board staff and that no further action related to the underground storage tank fuel release was required at that time. Prior to issuance of a remedial action completion certificate and case closure, we requested that the monitoring wells at the site be properly decommissioned, should the monitoring wells have no further use at the site. To date, we have not received a report documenting the well decommissioning. Therefore, the fuel leak case remains open. In order to close out this fuel leak case, please decommission the monitoring wells and provide documentation of the well decommissioning to this office. A remedial action completion certificate will be issued following receipt of the documentation.

The case will be closed with the following site management requirements:

"Case closure for the fuel leak site is granted for commercial land use only. If a change in land use to residential or other conservative scenario occurs at this property, Alameda County Environmental Health must be notified and the case needs to be re-evaluated. These site management requirements are to be entered into the City of Emeryville's OSIRIS (One Stop Interactive Resource information System) Map Server due to the residual contamination posing a nuisance for subsurface utility work."
