Dear Mr. Wiederhold and Mesdames Colbert and Andre:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff has reviewed the case file including the *Vapor Intrusion Evaluation Work Plan*, dated November 13, 2018. The work plan was prepared and submitted on your behalf by West Environmental Services & Technology. Thank you for submitting the work plan.

The work plan proposed to collect subslab or crawl space soil vapor at three tentative locations beneath the building at 2125 Williams Street. The identification of final sampling locations are pending a building survey to identify plumbing and piping systems, power and communication conduits, sumps, floor drains; evaluate structural elements of the building; review the HVAC system layout and intakes; building use schedules; and areas used for chemical or waste storage. Additionally, the location of onsite utility laterals, and offsite utility mains will be identified and located, and may affect placement of the vapor samples.

Based on ACDEH staff review of the case file, we request that you address the following technical comments and send us the reports described below.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

- 1. Work Plan Addendum Request Because of the importance of the input of a building and utility survey in selecting vapor sample locations, prior to final approval of the work plan, ACDEH requests the submittal of a Work Plan Addendum (Results of building and utility surveys, with revised vapor sample locations; Figure 2-1). ACDEH requests the figure include existing interior plans as well as future proposed locations of utilities including bathrooms (available online). The building is additionally reported to have contained a chemical laboratory at one time for research in unknown ink technologies at an unknown location in the building. Please ensure to locate the former laboratory on the figure(s).
- 2. Conditional Work Plan Approval The referenced work plan proposes a series of actions with which ACDEH is in general agreement of undertaking; however, ACDEH requests modifications to the approach. Upon approval of the revised sample location figure requested in Technical Comment 1 above, ACDEH will provide final approval for soil vapor sampling, and identify a date for report submittal.
 - a. Subslab Vapor Sample Collection One Liter (1 L) Summa canisters are proposed for subslab vapor samples. Please ensure these smaller containers are appropriate to achieve a detection limit below appropriate (residential) Environmental Screening Levels (ESLs).
 - b. Appropriate Environmental Screening Levels (ESLs) ACDEH has been advised by the City of San Leandro that the Adult Day Care facility can have the ability to change operations to a 24-hour basis in the future. Thus, please ensure that Detection Limits for residential ESLs can be met by the sampling media.

c. Analytical Methods – The work plan proposes to analyze the vapor samples by either TO-15 or TO-15 SIM. Please ensure that the appropriate analytical Detection Limits are achieved for residential in all vapor samples. This may require analysis by TO-15 SIM exclusively.
