RE: Groundwater Sampling at 2711 Union and 2730 Peralta Streets

Dear Mr. Sulprizio:

I was informed by your attorney Ms. Christine Noma, that you are the current property owner of both 2711 Union and 2730 Peralta Streets. As you recall, there was an ongoing subsurface investigation being conducted at 2711 Union Street, when the site was owned by Gardiner Manufacturing, Inc. The subsurface investigation must continue even though the property has changed hands.

A solvent plume has been identified that originated from 2711 Union Street. It also appears there is an off-site source that may be contributing to the solvent plume. As of today, the source of the upgradient and off-site contamination has not been determined. This office has requested the help of the Oakland Fire Department to identify potential responsible parties contributing to the solvent plume (see attached letter).

In the meantime, you are required to continue with the subsurface investigation and delineate the extent of the plume emanating from 2711 Union Street. This can be accomplished by sampling the on-site groundwater monitoring wells (namely Wells MW4, MW5 and MW6) at 2730 Peralta Street. Groundwater from these wells should be analyzed for chlorinated hydrocarbons, using EPA Method 8010 as well as TPHg, TPHd, MTBE and BTEX constituents.

The on-site groundwater monitoring wells at 2730 Peralta Street (MW4 through MW6) and MW-5 (on Peralta Street and installed for 2711 Union Street) should be sampled within 30 days of the date of this letter, or by May 24, 1999. A technical summary report is due 60 days upon completion of field work. Thereafter, these wells and those at 2711 Unions Street should be sampled on a semi-annual basis until further notice.

Enclosed is the relevant portion of Aqua Science Engineers' September 1998 "Report of Upgradient Groundwater Sampling" documenting the area survey conducted in the vicinity of 28th Street and Union Street in Oakland, CA. The purpose of the referenced investigation was to determine if there is an upgradient source of solvents detected in groundwater at 2711 Union Street. Analytical results of groundwater collected from an upgradient site (Linford property at 2850 Peralta Street), which reportedly did not use solvents, identified elevated levels of TCE.

This letter is to request that your office conduct inspections in the vicinity to determine if there are potential sources for the solvents identified in groundwater. If there is evidence suggesting there may have been releases of solvents to the subsurface, you may refer those cases/sites to this office for environmental oversite.

Enclosed please find a copy of the subject subpoena, which requests the personal appearance of Ms. Eva Chu on November 2, 1998 at 9:30 AM. After reviewing the documents and accepting the subpoena, I contacted the attorney of record, James J. Cherry, Esq.. I indicated to him that for a personal appearance there would have to be a \$150.00 up front fee, and that there was no mention of what documents, if any, should accompany Ms. Chu in a court appearance. Based upon this discussion, Mr. Cherry will forward an additional check in the amount of \$135.00 as a deposit, pending the calculation of actual costs of honoring the subpoena. In addition, he requested that Ms. Chu bring the applicable file(s) relative to the above businesses to the hearing on November 2, 1998.

In order to calculate the costs associated with Ms. Chu's appearance, it is necessary to request that the actual time involved in this matter, e.g., preparation for court hearing, travel time to the court, time while in court, and travel time returning to the office, needs to be documented. Also, the costs associated with the court appearance, e.g., bridge tolls, parking, mileage, etc., also need to be documented. After the court appearance the actual cost will be calculated and Mr. Cherry will either receive a refund or be requested to pay an additional sum of money.

I have completed reviewed your July 28, 1998 letter. Since then, we have communicated by telephone regarding the above referenced site. However, I thought it would be more appropriate to respond to your letter after additional groundwater data were collected.

In June 1998 a groundwater monitoring well, MW-5, was installed in Poplar Street, across from the subject property. Groundwater from this well was analyzed for chlorinated solvents. Analytical results exhibited higher concentrations of TCE than expected, suggesting that there may be another source for the contamination. In order to determine if there was a regional solvent plume and its extent and severity, I requested that offsite wells at 2850 Poplar Street (upgradient of subject property), and offsite wells at 2730 Peralta Street (downgradient of subject property) be sampled for chlorinated solvents. On August 24, 1998 groundwater from 2850 Poplar Street was sampled for chlorinated solvents. Your client, Custom Alloy, would not allow groundwater at 2730 Peralta Street to be sampled. Groundwater from 2850 Poplar contained up to 1,100ppb TCE. In addition, a drive-by survey was conducted by Aqua Science Engineers (ASE) to determine if an upgradient source of TCE may be identified. Several potential sources of solvent use and possible release to the subsurface were identified and need to be further investigated.

Your July 1998 letter had several comments on the investigation conducted to date. The following is our response to those comments:

Comment 1

"...in conducting the RBCA site assessment, Aqua Science used average concentrations in the groundwater wells for "representative concentrations." As a result, many of the risk calculations were based on representative concentrations much lower than those actually found on site. For example, the representative concentration of PCE was calculated by Aqua Science in its risk analysis at 310 ppb when in fact, the most recent level of concentration of PCE found in MW-3 was

4,400 ppb. Using the actual concentrations of PCE found at site in the risk analysis as opposed to the average concentration, the health risk would be exceeded for PCE groundwater volatilization to indoor air – RBCA 3.1E+0 (3100ppb) vs. 4,400 ppb in MW-3. This same criticism can be applied to the elevated levels of TCE – RBCA 1.1 E+0 (1400 ppb) vs. 2,000 ppb in MW-1."

ACDEH Response

Up to 4,400 ppb PCE was detected in groundwater from well MW-3 in June 1998. However, the RBCA analysis was performed in February 1998, before this data was collected. As you know, contaminant concentrations will vary over time, with changes in depth to groundwater, with various sampler and sampling techniques, with different laboratories, etc. For these reasons, it is acceptable to use average concentrations (from a specific timeframe) when conducting a risk assessment. In addition, a building is not constructed over one well point, therefore, a more accurate method of determining "representative concentrations" in groundwater beneath the property would be to average the groundwater concentrations throughout the property, rather than to select the maximum concentration of only one well point at any given time.

Comment 2

"Aqua Science's July 3, 1998, Off-Site Groundwater Assessment and Monitoring Report detected levels of TCE in the off-site well at 3,700 ppb which would exceed the health risk for groundwater volatilization to indoor air of 1.4 E+0. Nevertheless, Aqua Science's conclusion simply recommends further groundwater monitoring."

ACDEH Response

Well MW-5 has only been sampled once. In order to determine the validity of the TCE concentration, its value must be reproducible. Therefore, it is appropriate to conduct further groundwater sampling of well MW-5.

Also in your July 1998 letter you requested further guidance as to the following issues:

Given the levels of vinyl chloride, TCE, and PCE in the groundwater, can a building be built on the site?

Yes. At this time it appears vinyl chloride is the only compound posing a potential risk for on-site volatilization into an enclosed building using a very conservative risk model. A Tier III risk analysis can be conducted, or soil gas

vapors can be collected which may demonstrate that residual vinyl chloride does not pose a risk to human health.

If so, what restrictions would be required on use?

Undetermined.

3. Would remediation have to be undertaken prior to construction activities on site?

No.

4. While the average concentration of other VOCs such as TCE and PCE over the entire site are below the risk assessment levels, would building restrictions and construction activities restrictions be placed on the site based upon specific elevated levels of groundwater contamination?

No, but a site health and safety plan will be required for any construction/earth moving activities proposed at the site. Provided that excavation does not exceed 3'bgs, there should be no building or construction restrictions.

5. Will deed restrictions be required on the site not only restricting the use of the property, but also restricting construction activities?

Yes.

6. What would the deed restrictions consist of?

The site should be restricted to industrial or commercial use. Residential, daycare, or other sensitive receptor use will be restricted at the site.

7. Would the construction of an enclosed warehouse and office building be prohibited?

No. But a vapor barrier may mitigate potential vapor intrusion into buildings.

8. Will the use of the site be restricted to outdoor, non-enclosed storage, i.e. similar to the present use?

No.

9. Is groundwater remediation contemplated for the site?

Undetermined. If there is evidence there is still a source at the site, additional remediation may be required

10. As you know, generally, banks will not finance loans on properties that are contaminated until "site closure" or a "no further action" status is obtained on the site. What would be required to obtain no further action or site closure?

At this time the RWQCB does not grant site closure for sites containing VOCs in excess of MCLs.

11. Finally, will further remediation or investigation required for the threat of indoor TCE vapors into the adjacent office building?

Additional groundwater data is required to determine if indoor TCE vapors poses a risk to human health. After two additional quarters of groundwater sampling, the data will be reviewed to determine the next course of action.

12. What will that consist of?


If TCE concentrations exceed the established SSTLs, soil vapor gas samples can be collected within the adjacent office building. Or, a Tier III risk analysis can be performed.





It was determined that a risk assessment for the determination of cleanup levels for the above referenced site would be appropriate at this time. The risk assessment should include the following:

- soil concentrations to be used should be the average of all soil samples collected from above the mean depth to water;
- 2 groundwater data to be used should be the average concentration from all monitoring wells;
- exposure pathways should include soil and groundwater volatilization to both indoor and outdoor air for an onsite commercial scenario. An 8 hour exposure rate may be used;
- 4. risk to construction workers must also be evaluated;
- 5. site cleanup levels should be for a 10⁻⁵ risk; and,
- 6. groundwater data from wells MW-1 and MW-2 should be averaged to determine risk for an offsite commercial scenario.

And, in order to determine if the site has been adequately characterized, please provide the rationale for the location of each soil and groundwater sample collected to date.

Thank you for the submittal of additional funds to oversee site remediation of the above referenced site.

Subsurface investigations performed to date have identified elevated TPH (up to 4,500ppm oil and grease and 4,300ppm TPH as diesel) and lead (up to 150ppm) in shallow soil (~3.5'bgs). In addition to TPH, elevated HVOCs (up to 1,800ppb PCE, 2,600ppb TCE, 440ppb 1,2-DCE and 170ppb vinyl chloride) have also been identified in groundwater beneath the site.

At this time a review of historic use (often called a Phase 1, Site Assessment) of the above chemicals of concern at sites within 1,000' of the subject site should be performed to determine if any of the contaminants identified may be coming from offsite; may be migrating offsite; or may be a regional problem.

Information gathered from this review will determine if additional investigations will be required to delineate the extent of the plume. If not, a risk analysis can then be use to determine acceptable cleanup levels for the site.

This office is in receipt of and has completed review of the case file for this site, up to and including the October 30, 1996 - Aqua Science Engineers (ASE) "Report of Soil and Groundwater Assessment".

As documented in the October 30, 1996 ASE report, laboratory analysis of soil samples, collected at a depth of approximately 6.0 feet bgs from borings MW-2 and MW-4, revealed total petroleum hydrocarbons as diesel (TPHd) at concentrations of 350 mg/kg and 280 mg/kg, respectively. Fluorene was detected at a maximum concentration of 0.048 mg/kg, from the soil sample collected at a depth of approximately 6.0 feet bgs (boring MW-4).

Laboratory analysis of samples collected from the four groundwater monitoring wells revealed vinyl chloride, cis-1,2-DCE, trans-1,2-DCE, TCE, PCE and chlorobenzene at maximum concentrations of 160, 200, 47, 2200, 520 and 32 ug/L (ppb), respectively.

At this time please adhere to a quarterly schedule of well sampling, monitoring, and report submittal as referenced in California Health and Safety Code section 25187.1. Sample analytes shall be total petroleum hydrocarbons as diesel and gasoline (TPHg and TPHd), total oil and grease (TOG), methyl-tert-butyl ether (MTBE), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), polyaromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), the metals lead, chromium, zinc, nickel and cadmium, and the aromatic hydrocarbons benzene, toluene, ethyl benzene and total xylene isomers (BTEX).

Sampling of monitoring wells MW-1, MW-2, MW-3 and MW-4 should continue until four consecutive sampling events have documented levels of chemicals in groundwater samples analyzed from the four wells. This office will re-evaluate the case file after review of the first quarter 1997 groundwater sampling report, to determine if any further investigations are warranted for this site.



This office is in receipt of and has completed review of the case file for this site, up to and including the September 23, 1996 - Aqua Science Engineers (ASE) "Work Plan for a Soil and Groundwater Assessment".

This work plan details the advancement of three soil borings with subsequent conversion to groundwater monitoring wells installed to depths of approximately 20 feet below ground surface (bgs). Undisturbed soil samples will be collected at least every 5-foot intervals, at lithographic changes, and from just above the water table. A minimum of one soil sample collected from each boring is to be analyzed for TPHg, TPHd, BTEX, MTBE, VOCs and PAHs.

This offices requests that one well be installed on the eastern edge of the property along Union Street, in close proximity to boring location BH-E. This well would be used to monitor groundwater conditions in the "inferred" up-gradient direction from the site, and would allow for a better determination of groundwater gradient over a much larger area of the site.

The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health, Environmental Protection Division has completed review of the Soil and Groundwater Assessment Report, dated April 23, 1996 and prepared by Aqua Science Engineers Inc. for the above referenced site.

The site was previously used by Gardiner Manufacturing as a machining and press operation. Custom Alloy Scrap, a metal scrap recycler is the current tenant.

A total of ten soil borings were drilled at the site. Five soil borings were drilled to five feet bgs with a hand auger and five soil borings were drilled to groundwater (approximately 10 feet bgs). Contamination was detected in soil as high as 7.6 ppm TPH gasoline, 4300 ppm TPH diesel, 4500 ppm TOG, 0.01 ppm toluene, 9.2 ppb ethylbenzene, 16 ppb xylene, 55 ppb cis-1,2 DCE, 18 ppb trans-1,2-DCE, 52 ppb TCE, 1.1 ppm cadmium, 46 ppm chromium, 150 ppm lead, 24 ppm nickel and 120 ppm zinc. Groundwater contamination was also detected at the following concentration: 95 ppb TPH gasoline, 7100 ppb TPH diesel, 8000 ppb TOG, 0.9 ppb ethylbenzene, 1.3 ppb xylenes, 43 ppb vinyl chloride, 2.1 ppb 1,1 DCE, 22 ppb 1,1 DCA, 78 ppb cis 1,2, DCE, 15 ppb trans 1,2 DCE, 100 ppb TCE, 1 ppb PCE, 21 ppb chlorobenzene, 39 ppb 1,2 dichlorobenzene, 2.3 ppb cadmium and 1000 ppb nickel.
