Dear Ms. Hugo:

Confirming my various e-mails and telephone conversations with you, as we advised you, Croley & Herring believes that the case closure letter dated July 9, 2001, is too narrow and restrictive. The case closure letter fails to address site closure with respect to petroleum hydrocarbons, BTEX and PAHs.

The history of the site has involved sampling of four monitoring wells. MW-2 and MW-3 are located along the north and south sides of the western boundary of the property. VOCs, TPH, and BTEX were never found in these wells. (Attached as Exhibit A is a copy of the Quarterly Groundwater Monitoring Report dated March 22, 1990 prepared AWD Technologies, reporting no detection of petroleum hydrocarbons, BTEX or VOCs in MW2 and 3).

EW-1 and MW-4 are located along the eastern boundary of the site. Petroleum, BTEX and VOCs were primarily a problem in EW1 which was located in the alley way behind the Good Guys building. However, the solvents were aggressively remediated by Croley & Herring, and by letters dated September 18, 1996, and September 30, 1996, site closure was granted as to chlorinated solvent contamination. (Attached as Exhibit B).

The only remaining sampling to be performed on EW-1 and MW-4 was continued monitoring for petroleum hydrocarbons, BTEX and PAHs. After one year of monitoring, the Agency agreed to review the site as a low risk groundwater case. See letter dated May 2, 1997 from Susan Hugo to Richard Herring attached as Exhibit C.

In 1999, Croley & Herring, along with the adjacent property owner, F.P. Lathrop, then retained the services of Cambria Environmental Technology (Cambria) to seek site closure with respect to the residual petroleum hydrocarbons, BTEX and PAHs on **both** sites. By letter dated March 5, 1999, Cambria prepared a health risk assessment addressing the remaining contaminants. Cambria found that the primary contaminants of concern ("COC") were petroleum hydrocarbons, heavy hydrocarbons, PAHs, and certain VOCs. Cambria concluded that VOCs had been remediated to acceptable levels. The PAHs were found to be creosote with naphthalene deemed to be most representative of the detected PAHs.

Cambria conducted a risk assessment evaluation with consideration as to natural attenuation. Cambria's conclusion was that because the Croley & Herring building and the Lathrop building are standard slab on grade concrete and/or cinder block construction and since the areas outside of the building footprints are covered with asphalt paving and concrete sidewalks, no health risk exists under current use conditions. Cambria found that the results of the RBCA analysis showed that site specific concentrations of all COCs and specifically benzene, are below their site specific threshold levels indicating that there are no specific risks to onsite occupants from the COCs detected beneath the Lathrop site. Cambria further concluded that while a site specific risk analysis was not performed for the Croley & Herring site, the results of the analysis performed on the Lathrop property are also valid for the Croley & Herring site. This is based upon the fact that the building and subsurface conditions are nearly identical and valid for both sites.

Cambria also conducted a fate and transport analysis for the dissolved naphthalene plume, and determined that the levels were below the SFIA Order No. 95-136 Salt Water Ecological Protection Zone Tier One standard. Cambria's conclusion and assessment was that COCs, petroleum hydrocarbons, BTEX and PAHs detected in soil and groundwater do not pose a significant threat to persons occupying the site. Accordingly, based upon the Cambria report, case closure with respect to the Croley & Herring's site as to petroleum hydrocarbons, BTEX and PAHs, is supported. (Attached as Exhibit D is a copy of the Cambria Request for Change of Regulatory Status).

A summary of our site closure request with respect to each of the wells at the Croley & Herring site is as follows:

MW-2, MW-3: Petroleum hydrocarbons, BTEX and VOCs have always been a non-detect. While PAH contamination was not analyzed for MW-2 and MW-3, in view of the fact that VOCs, petroleum hydrocarbons, and BTEX have always been non-detect, there is no reason to suspect that there would be any PAHs at MW-2 or -MW-3. Further, in reviewing the boring logs, when MW-2 and MW-3 were installed, there was no evidence of contamination. In fact, the soil borings adjacent to MW-2 and MW-3, the foundation borings, had no evidence of any contaminants. (Attached as Exhibit E are the soil sampling and groundwater monitoring installation reports.)

EW-1, MW-4: Site Closure as to VOCs was granted in 1996. Closure as to petroleum hydrocarbons, BTEX and PAHs is supported by the Cambria report.

Therefore, we request that the case closure letter be modified to reflect the previous closures granted in the case and to reflect the findings of the Cambria report. We enclose our proposed revisions to the Case Closure Letter. Thank you for your consideration of this request.

Dear Mr. Herring:

This agency has reviewed the case file concerning the solvent release found in soil and groundwater at the above referenced site. The property is in a commercial section of Emeryvillo and currently leased to the Good Guys Store, an electronic merchandise retailer.

Soil contamination (halogenated volatile organic compounds) was detected at the site in 1988. Site investigation was conducted and identified that surface release was associated with operations of tenants at the facility. The contamination was found to be localized in narrow alleyway behind the building. Contaminated soil along the alleyway was excavated to a depth of approximately five feet. In addition, a vapor extraction system (VES) was installed to mitigate residual volatile organic compounds in soil at the site. Confirmation soil samples were collected and the soil VES was decommissioned in December 1991. An in-door vapor monitoring system was also installed inside the building from 1989 to 1993 with no methane detected during the monitoring period.

In 1992, an electrokinetic enhanced in-situ biotreatment system was installed to remediate VOCs found in groundwater beneath the site. Chlorinated solvents in groundwater were subsequently treated to below detection limits and a closure letter was issued in 1996 for the chlorinated solvents found at the site. However, continued groundwater monitoring for petroleum hydrocarbons and volatile organic compounds was required. Groundwater has been monitored at the site from 1989 to 1998. The last groundwater sampling collected from monitoring wells EW-1 and MW-4 in 1998 showed up to 4,240 parts per billion (ppb) of Total Petroleum Hydrocarbon (TPH) as gasoline, 808 ppb benzene, 1970 ppb toluene, 174 ppb xylenes, 297 ppb ethylbenzene. Methyl tertiary butyl ether (MTBE) was not detected in groundwater beneath the site.

This agency and the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board have evaluated the historical data/collected for the referenced site. Both agencies agreed that the site is a low risk site - and the environmental reports based on the following rationale:

The extent of contaminants in soil and groundwater has been adequately defined.

The plume is stable and limited in extent.

Primary source of contamination has been removed / remediated.

By letters dated September 18, 1996 and September 30, 1996, site closure was granted by this agency with the concurrence of the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Ouality Control Board as to chlorinated solvent contamination. Sampling and monitoring for petroleum hydrocarbons and BTEX continued to be performed on monitoring wells EW-1 and MW-4. On March 5, 1999, Cambria Environmental Technology (Cambria) was retained by the property owner, Croley and Herring Investment Company and the adjacent property owner, F.P. Lathrop to conduct a health risk assessment and to evaluate natural attenuation. Cambria evaluated petroleum hydrocarbons, BTEX and PAHs. The PAHs were found to be creosote with naphthalene deemed to be most representative of the detected PAHs. Cambria found that the results of its RBCA analysis showed that site specific concentrations of all chemicals of concern were below their site specific threshold levels indicating that there were no specific risk to onsite occupants. The current Good Guys store is a standard slab on grade concrete and/or cinder block construction, and the areas outside the building footprint is covered with asphalt paving and concrete sidewalks. Cambria found that under these site conditions, no health risk exists. Cambria also conducted a fate and transport analysis for dissolved napthalene and determined that the levels were below the SFIA Order No. 95-136 Salt Water Ecological Protection Zone Tier One. Cambria, therefore, concluded that the petroleum hydrocarbons, BTEX and PAHs detected in soil and groundwater did not pose a significant threat to persons occupying the site.

- No water wells, deeper drinking water aquifers, surface water, or other sensitive receptors
 are likely to be impacted.
- The site presents no significant risk to human health and the environment.
- Institutional controls have been implemented at the site. On February 27, 2001, a deed restriction was recorded for the site. A copy of the recorded deed restriction was submitted to Emeryville Building and Planning Department.

Therefore, based upon the available information and with the provision that the information provided to this agency was accurate and representative of site conditions, no further action regarding the solvent release is required at the subject site.







New Laws Affecting Recording Practices

This letter is to notify the general public of recent changes in the laws which govern recording official record documents:

 Pursuant to Assembly Bill 2935, Chapter 924, Statutes of 2000, effective January 1, 2001, the following provision has been deleted from California Civil Code Section 2952:

"Whenever a mortgage of trust deed is presented for recordation containing a reference to provisions in a fictitious mortgage or trust deed, with a part or all of the provisions typed, written, or printed on the mortgage or trust deed preceded by "do not record" or "not to be recorded" or the like, the county recorder shall record only the mortgage or trust deed portion of the document and shall not be liable for failing to make a record of the portion of the document bearing provisions preceded by the instructions not to record."

Essentially, this allows for and therefore, effective January 01, 2001 our office will record and charge for *all* pages of documents with text. This includes but is not necessarily limited to:

Deeds of Trust Fictitious Mortgages or Trust Deeds Abstract of Judgements

2. Pursuant to Senate Bill 2002, Chapter 1003, effective July 01, 2001 the filing/recording fee for Uniform Commercial Code (UCC) documents on the California standard form will be \$5.00. For other UCC forms, free-form financing statements, and out-of-state UCC forms, the fee will be \$10.00.

This department has reviewed the "Request for Final Closure and Groundwater Monitoring Report" dated January 1997, prepared by Environment & Technology Services (ETS) and submitted under cover letter by Ms. Christine Noma of Wendel, Rosen Black & Dean on February 28, 1997 for the above referenced site.

Groundwater sample collected from well EW-1 during the last sampling event on 1/22/97 showed TPH gasoline (30,000 ppb), benzene (7 ppb), toluene (3,220 ppb), ethylbenzene (12 ppb) and xylene (55 ppb). The groundwater sample collected from MW-4 found TPH gasoline (2,480 ppb), benzene (659 ppb), toluene (95 ppb), ethylbenzene (58 ppb), xylene (104 ppb) and PAHs (95 ppb acenaphthene, 70 ppb acenaphthylene & 3,900 ppb naphthalene). MTBE was not detected in both wells. An off-site well (C-3) which is adjacent to the subject site was sampled. Analytic results showed TPH gasoline (2,830 ppb), benzene (818 ppb), toluene (91 ppb), ethylbenzene (123 ppb) xylene (139 ppb) and PAHs (150 ppb acenaphthene, 53 ppb acenaphthylene, 4800 ppb naphthalene, 31 ppb fluorene & 71 ppb phenanthrene).

The groundwater monitoring program must be continued at the subject site. Monitoring wells EW-1 and MW-4 must be sampled every six months for the following target compounds: TPH gasoline, benzene, toluene, ethylenbenzene, xylene and PAHs. After one year of additional groundwater monitoring, the historical data collected for the site can be evaluated to determine if the site can be closed as a low risk groundwater case.

This letter will confirm our Fhone conversation today regarding your letter of September 30, 1996 concerning remediation activity at the above site.

In addition to no further remediation of chlorinated solvents, we are not being required to do remediation on EETX compounds based on current levels of contamination. Since we will continue to monitor BETX compounds on a semi-annual basis, we may, at our option, do passive remediation such as adding oxygen producing additives to enhance natural degredation of the BETX compounds. We understand that adverse changes in semi-annual monitoring may require mandatory remediation at some time in the future.

Also, with regard to your letter of September 18, comment number one allows us to close down monitoring wells MW-2 and MW-3. This will confirm we will close well MW-3 but retain open well MW-2 for use in establishing ground water flow direction, thus precluding a new well for this purpose.

Cur next semi-annual monitoring for well EW-1 and MW-4 will take place in January 1997 at which time we will be reporting our results to your office.

The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health, Environmental Protection Division has reviewed the Draft Groundwater Case Closure Request (August 1996) prepared by Environment & Technology Services and submitted under cover letter dated August 20, 1996 by Ms. Christine Noma of Wendel, Rosen, Black & Dean for the above referenced site.

This office has the following comments regarding the soil / groundwater investigation at the subject site:

- 1) Groundwater monitoring wells MW-2 and MW-3 (previously dropped from the sampling program) which have been measured for groundwater elevation levels can be closed. However, you will need to locate a third well (in addition MW-4 and EW-1) that can be used to establish groundwater flow direction at the gite
- 2) Chlorinated solvents have not been detected in groundwater monitoring well MW-4 during the last four sampling events (1/19/94, 1/25/95, 9/18/95,3/25/96). Therefore, this target compound can be dropped from the sampling program. However, continued groundwater monitoring must occur in well MW-4 to establish that the plume is stable and not migrating off site. Well MW-4 should be sampled every six months for the following target compounds: TPH as gasoline, benzene (B), toluene (T), ethyl benzene (E), xylene (X) and methyl tertiary butyl ether (MTBE).
- 3) Monitoring well EW-1 is still detecting the presence of aromatic hydrocarbons. The last sampling event collected on 7/11/96 showed aromatic hydrocarbons at the following concentrations: 5,870 ppb toluene, 13 ppb xylene, 55 ppb ethylbenzene. Monitoring well EW-1 should be sampled every six months for the following target compounds: TPH gasoline, BTEX and MTBE.

This office represents Croley & Herring Investment Company. As you may recall, this is the site where the Good Guys store is presently located in Emeryville. VOC contamination was discovered at the site, primarily, trichlorethylene and trichloroethane, and toluene. In addition, gasoline and gasoline constituents, benzene, toluene, ethyl benzene and xylene were discovered in the groundwater. After a period of active remediation which involved soil excavation, soil vapor extraction, and insitu bioremediation of groundwater, Croley & Herring has been conducting groundwater monitoring on two wells. The VOC contamination levels in the groundwater was remediated to nondetect in the 1993 groundwater quarterly monitoring. At that time, the Regional Water Quality Control Board, however, would not agree to "no further action" status at the site due to the presence of the BTEX constituents.

In 1994, as a result of a number of soil borings being drilled on the adjacent property, 5813 Shellmound Street (Lathrop site), the levels of VOCs increased. However, since the cessation of further drilling activity on the adjacent property, the VOC levels have again exhibited a downward decreasing trend, as confirmed by the September 1995 quarterly samples.

Croley & Herring now expects to reiterate its request for "no further action" after its next semi-annual monitoring which is scheduled to occur in March, 1996.

As a prelude to that request, however, we would like to schedule a meeting with you to obtain a preliminary opinion as to the likelihood of such a site closure. In that regard, we enclose the lab results of interim groundwater monitoring which was conducted in January, 1996. While the levels are higher than the September, 1995 readings due to the rains, as you can see, the downward trend in VOC and BTEX constituents continues, i.e., January 1996 levels are much less than January 1995.

In order to impress upon you the importance of obtaining site closure, we provide you with the following background to the pending litigation involving both the Croley & Herring site and the Lathrop site:

Croley & Herring filed suit in Federal District Court in September 1994, against the tenants which had operated at the site, seeking reimbursement for clean up expenses. The defendants included Fisher Berkeley Corporation, Flexo Packaging Services, Inc., Gleason Business Machines, Milligan-Spika Company, Fibreboard Corporation, and the upgradient neighbor, F.P. Lathrop dba Lathrop Construction Company who had an underground storage tank on his property (tank was removed).

The parties to the litigation recently completed an exhaustive two day mediation session with the Honorable Layn Phillips, retired federal court judge, serving as a mediator. A tentative settlement was reached amongst the parties whereby the tenants would be reimbursing Croley & Herring for the contamination on the site. However, as a condition to that settlement, Croley & Herring is required to obtain either no further action status or a conditional closure with limited monitoring as to both the Croley & Herring site and the Lathrop site. (Lab results from our January 1996 sampling of Lathrop's wells are also enclosed.) Therefore, it is absolutely critical that closure or conditional site closure be achieved.

Croley & Herring also requires closure on the property for economic and financial reasons. Presently, a loan exists on the property. A balloon payment balance is due in December, 1996. In order to refinance the property or to market the property for sale, Croley & Herring must have site closure or conditional closure no later than June, 1996.

For both of the above reasons, to settle and resolve the pending litigation and for refinancing purposes, it is of vital

importance to Croley & Herring to obtain your input as to site closure. Therefore, Dick Herring, Walter Loo of ETS Consulting, and I would like to meet with you to obtain a preliminary indication from you as to the feasibility of closure. We would like to arrange this meeting as soon as possible, and I will be contacting you with in the next day or two to schedule a convenient time for said meeting.

Thank you for your consideration of this request.



groundwater monitoring was required. In view of the LLNL report, however, we believe that it is appropriate to revisit the issue of site closure given the natural attenuation which is occurring at the site.

Following telephone conversations with you concerning the "direction" of the investigation, and with the concurrence of Rich Hiett, with the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board, this office authorizes you to modify your frequency of monitoring from quarterly to annually. At well EW-1, the concentration of the VOCs still fluctuates while the last reading showed some dramatic reduction in the gasoline related compounds. We will continue to monitor well EW-1 while the in-situ electro-biochemical treatment experiment is still on going.

Enclosed please find a copy of a wastewater discharge permit application for the subject activities. The owner of the property is Croley and Herring Investment Company and the future lessee of the facility is the Good Guys, Inc.

The proposed process involves the extraction of shallow groundwater and treatment with aqueous phase activated carbon prior to the discharge to the East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD) sewer system.

The water balance is estimated at about one gallon per minute discharge rate. The groundwater plume volume is estimated at about 127,000 gallons. The duration of the treatment discharge is estimated at 3 to 12 months.

The contaminated shallow groundwater will be extracted from Well EW-1. (Figure 1). There are 5 other groundwater quality samples collected from MW-1, MW-2, MW-3, TW-1 and TW-2. Samples from MW-2, MW-3 and TW-2 showed no detectable volatile organic compounds (VOCs). MW-1 showed 18 part per billion (ppb) of total VOCs. TW-1 showed 47 ppb of total VOCs. EW-1 showed 1 ppm of total VOCs including 640 ppb of TCE, 190 ppb of toluene and 170 ppb of xylenes. The laboratory analysis sheets for these water samples are attached.

The extraction Well EW-1 is in place. The extracted groundwater will be diverted to an aqueous phase activated carbon system for removal of the VOCs. The aqueous phase activated carbon system included two 55-gallon drums of activated carbon (150 lbs each) connected in series to prevent breakthrough. The total VOCs in 127,000 gallons of groundwater (plume volume) at 1 ppm maximum strength is about 8 pounds. The adsorption capacity of each 55-gallon drum of carbon is estimate at 10 to 15 pounds of VOCs.

The connection of the discharge from the activated carbon drums to the sewer is indicated in Figure 2.

There is no pretreatment system involved in this proposed treatment system.

For initial testing, the extracted groundwater and the discharge water samples will be analyzed and compared for removal efficiency. Water samples will be taken between the carbon drums and at the discharge point. No discharge will be diverted to the sewer until the laboratory result for the discharge point sample indicates non-detectable with EPA 601 and 602 method of analysis. The analysis will be performed by a certified analytical laboratory. The follow up discharge will be analyzed on a quarterly basis as with the groundwater monitoring wells on the property.

The Alameda County Health Services is the lead agency on the soil cleanup and groundwater investigation effort. The contact person is Mr. Dennis Byrne.

An unspecified source of organic solvents were discovered at the alley way (Figure 1). The contaminated soil was excavated and is currently being treated. Three permanent groundwater monitoring wells were installed plus three temporary groundwater sample point were established.

We propose to start the groundwater extraction/treatment on July 15, 1989.




