Alameda County Environmental Health staff has reviewed the January 5, 2005 Workplan for a Soil and Groundwater Assessment for the referenced site prepared by Aqua Science Engineers, ASE. The objective of this work is to satisfy the County's request for additional information, with the intention of obtaining site closure for unrestricted property use. Our office requests that the following technical comments be addressed when performing the proposed work.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

- 1. Because of the uncertainty regarding historical site use and use locations, we request that two additional borings be advanced in addition to the two proposed in your work plan. We have attached a copy of Figure 2, indicating the recommended locations for the two other borings.
- 2. Because of the historical use of the site being vehicle service and/or machine shop we request that soil and groundwater samples be tested for the waste oil UST leak constituents ie TPH as gasoline, TPH as diesel, oil and grease, BTEX, chlorinated solvents, MTBE, EDB, EDC, semi-volatiles and the CAM 17 metals. Soil samples should be analyzed based upon indication of contamination and in the absence of evidence of contamination, taken from the capillary zone. Soil samples must be below the initial excavation depth, if within the previously excavated area.
- 3. Please notify our office with 48 hours prior notice prior to conducting this work.

Please submit your technical investigation report within 60 days of completion of the work.



Alameda County Environmental Health staff has reviewed the case file for the subject site including the August 3, 2004 ASE *Phase I Environmental Assessment Report* and determined that additional information is needed to progress toward case closure. Given the historic use of the site from the 1930s through 2001 as a vehicle service facility and/or machine shop, we request that you evaluate shallow groundwater for the presence of heavy metals and volatile organic compounds. In addition, given the lack of investigation for the presence of chemicals of concern (COC) in soil other than lead and the unknown location(s) of historic chemical activities our office will only be able to comment on the completeness of your investigation of lead once the requested work is performed.

Subject: Toxics Case No. RO0002537, 1455 5th St., Oakland, CA 94607

Alameda County Environmental Health staff has reviewed the case file for the subject site and determined that additional information is needed to progress toward case closure. We request that you evaluate shallow groundwater for the presence of soluble lead and mercury. These analytes were initially detected at levels of potential concern. In order to evaluate site closure for unrestricted land use, an appropriate groundwater sample should be collected and tested for these chemicals.

Alameda County Environmental Health staff has reviewed the case file for the referenced site including the Aqua Science Engineers (ASE) August 8, 2003 Workplan for Excavation and Offsite Disposal of Lead-Bearing Soil. The work plan proposes the excavation of specific areas of the property to defined depths and the collection and analysis of confirmation soil samples for lead. Our office concurs with the work plan, however, please observe the following technical comment when performing this work.

TECHNICAL COMMENT

1. The area of proposed excavation near former boring B-14 should be increased to a depth of 3' based upon prior analytical data.

Re: Final Notice of Violation

Dear Sir:

This letter serves as your final notice of violation for failure to comply with the requirements of the California Health and Safety Code.

As the property owner of 2235 Clement Ave. in Alameda you were made aware of the laws and regulations governing the monitoring and closure requirements for underground tanks on June 23, 1988. Since that contact, numerous attempts have been made by this office to assist you in gaining compliance. In addition to several telephone conversations where monitoring alternatives and closure requirements were discussed with yourself and employees of your management firm, forms for tank registration and tank closure were sent both to yourself and Barbara Spaldy on June 23, and November 8, 1988.

On December 8, 1988 this office was contacted by your attorney, Mr. Fred Howell. The status of the underground tank and responsibility for the tank were discussed. Mr. Howell was informed that January 1989 would be the deadline for an adequate response to the concerns of Alameda County. To date, no response has been received by this office that indicates an acceptance of responsibility or a course of action involving the underground tank.

You are again made aware of the code sections the responsible party is in violation of:

California Health and Safety Code, Section 25284, which states, no person shall own or operate an underground storage tank unless a permit for it's operation has been issued by the local agency to the owner.

California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299 (a1,2,5), which states, any operator of an underground storage tank is liable for a civil penalty of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) or more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per day for operating an underground storage tank which has not been issued a permit, or fails to monitor the underground storage tank, or fails to properly close an underground storage tank.

California Health and Safety Code, section 25299 (b1,3,4), which states, any owner of an underground storage tank is liable for a civil penalty of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) or more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per day for failing to obtain a permit, for abandoning or improperly closing any underground tank, or for knowing failure to take reasonable and necessary steps to assure compliance with this chapter by the operator of an underground tank.

It has become apparent to this office that legal action against your facility will be required to gain compliance. The Alameda County District Attorney's Office has been so notified, and they have been requested to open a file on this facility.

You are requested to respond to this office with a report on the status of the underground tank at your facility within ten days from the above letter date.

Dear Sir:

This letter serves as your final notice of violation for failure to comply with the requirements of the California Health and Safety Code.

Your facility was made aware of the laws and regulations governing the monitoring and closure requirements for underground tanks on June 14, 1988. Since that contact, numerous attempts were been made by this office to assist you in gaining compliance. In addition to several telephone conversations with yourself and the attorney for Reliance Sheet and Strip, your facility was visited by Hazardous Materials Specialist, Ariu Levi. The appropriate forms for tank permitting or closure and removal were sent to representatives of the property owners on June 23, and November 8, 1988.

On November 30, 1988 this office was contacted by your attorney, Steve Denebeim, and informed that a decision concerning the status of the underground tank would be reached within two weeks. To date, no response has been received by this office that indicates an acceptance of responsibility or a course of action involving the underground tank.

You are again made aware of the code sections you are in violation of:

California Health and Safety Code, Section 25284, which states, no person shall own or operate an underground storage tanks unless a permit for it's operation has been issued by the local agency to the owner.

California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299 (a1,2,5), which states, any operator of an underground storage tank is liable for a civil penalty of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) or more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per day for operating an underground storage tank which has not been issued a permit, or fails to monitor the underground storage tank, or fails to properly close an underground storage tank.

California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299 (b1,3,4), which states, any owner of an underground storage tank is liable for a civil penalty of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500) or more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per day for failing to obtain a permit, for abandoning or improperly closing any underground tank, or for knowing failure to to take reasonable and necessary steps to assure compliance with this chapter by the operator of an underground tank.

It has become apparent to this office that legal action against your facility will be required to gain compliance. The Consumer and Environmental Protection Division of the Alameda County District Attorney's Office has been so notified, and they have been requested to open a file for this facility.

You are requested to respond to this office with a report on the status of the underground tank at your facility within ten days from the above letter date.
