Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff reported a release from your former gasoline underground storage tank (UST) system removed from your property on February 5th and February 7th, This office subsequently listed the subject site on our database of fuel leak sites. Our office acts as the lead agency to oversee the investigation and cleanup of petroleum hydrocarbon releases. We have recently reviewed the information in our file and determined that up to 1,600 ppm TPHG, 290 ppm TPHD, and 6.7 ppm Benzene were left in place in soil. Groundwater was not encountered during the excavation. However, groundwater investigation is necessary at this site to progress toward case closure.

Please define the extent of soil and groundwater at your site. This type of investigation usually involves drilling one or more soil borings and collecting soil samples for chemical analyses. Groundwater monitoring wells may be needed and groundwater sampled to properly characterize groundwater contamination. Other options for additional investigation may be appropriate to define contamination at your site.

Please submit a work plan detailing your proposal to define the extent of soil and groundwater contamination by May 26 2004. This report is being requested pursuant to the Regional Water Quality Control Board's (Regional Board) authority under Section 13267 of the California Water Code.

AB 681 (MACHADO) CHAPTER 255, STATUTES OF 1998

AB 681 (Machado) Chapter 255, Statutes of 1998, has made legislative changes to Chapters 6.7 and 6.75 of the Health and Safety Code adding new requirements to landowner notification and participation requirements for fuel leak investigations. These legislative changes require the active or primary responsible party for a fuel leak case to ensure that all current property owners of the site are informed of cleanup actions or requests

for closure and to forward to ACEH a complete mailing list of all record fee title holders to the site so that we can ensure that they are listed as responsible parties and kept informed about cleanup and closure decisions.

Additionally, the primary or active responsible party must certify in writing that the notification requirement of Health and Safety Code, Section 25297.15, has been met and provide a mailing list of all record fee title owners to the local agency. This certification shall be included with a perjury statement in the cover letter transmitting reports, work plans, and requests for closure.

UST CLEANUP FUND

Please be advised that you might be eligible for reimbursement of the costs of investigation from the California UST Cleanup Fund (Fund). In some cases, a deductible amount may apply. Enclosed is a fact sheet concerning the Fund. If you believe you meet the eligibility requirements, I strongly encourage you to call the Fund for an application.

AGENCY OVERSIGHT

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement follow up. Enforcement follow up may include administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 20, Chapter 6.75.

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has received and reviewed "Final Closure Report For Underground Storage Tanks" (USTs), dated March 25, 2003, which reported a release from your former USTs system removed from your property on February 4, 2003. This office subsequently listed the subject site on our database of fuel leak sites. Our office acts as the lead agency to oversee the investigation and cleanup of petroleum hydrocarbon releases. We have recently reviewed the information in our file and determined that up to 1600 ppm TPHg, 290 ppm of TPHd, and 6.7 ppm Benzene were detected in soil from the tank excavation and that a soil and groundwater investigation is necessary at this site to progress toward case closure.

Please define the extent of soil and groundwater at your site. This type of investigation usually involves drilling one or more soil borings and collecting soil samples for chemical analyses. Groundwater monitoring wells may be needed and groundwater sampled to properly characterize groundwater contamination. Other options for additional investigation may be appropriate to define contamination at your site.

Please submit a work plan detailing your proposal to define the extent of soil and groundwater contamination by **November 14, 2003**. This report is being requested pursuant to the Regional Water Quality Control Board's (Regional Board) authority under Section 13267 of the California Water Code.

REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

ACEH's files for the subject site contains one report documenting UST removal activities, dated September 27, 2002, prepared by Golden Gate Tank Removal, Inc. It appears that additional work was performed at this site however; report(s) documenting this work have not been submitted to us. We request that you submit copies of any other reports you have documenting additional investigation activities or other work related to this UST system/site by November 14, 2003.

AB 681 (MACHADO) CHAPTER 255, STATUTES OF 1998

Your claim has been found to be ineligible for placement on the Priority List for the following reason:

Statutes of Chapter 6.7 Health and Safety Code (H&SC), §25284.(a)(1)(c) states in part... "no person shall own or operate an underground storage tank (UST) unless a permit has been issued by the local agency."

Mr. Kumar is ineligible for participation in the Fund for this claim due to failure to comply with the permit requirement of §25299.57(d)(3)(A) Chapter 6.75 H&SC, Petroleum Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund.

Permit compliance is a statutory condition imposed for access to the Fund. The specific permit required is the permit to own or operate the UST pursuant to §25284 of the H&SC.



III. Scope of Work

The project includes the removal of five underground storage tanks, sampling soil and possibly groundwater. A tank closure report transmitting the results of the removal will be submitted to Oakland Fire Dept. OES.

IV. Site Characterization and Analysis

A. Site Information

- 1. Location of site: 829 54th Street, Oakland, California 94601
- 2. Approximate size of site: commercial lot.
- 3. Site topography: Relatively flat with tanks under concrete on Southwestern portion of property.
- 4. Site Accessibility: The site is accessible from the main driveway on 54th Street.
- 5. Pathways for hazardous substance dispersion: Hazardous substances likely to be present are moderately volatile and could dissipate into the air. The primary paths for dispersion are through the air, soil and groundwater.
- 6. Anticipated weather conditions are temperate but stresses could arise from elevated temperature and/or humidity. The site is located in a moderate climate zone, however, extreme heat for workers can occur during the summer months (June through October). If work is performed during the wet months (November through May), workers should be prepared for rain.
- 7. Past use of site: The site is a former service station
- 8. Current use of site: The site is currently used for vehicle storage and maintenance.

B. Description of Constituents of Concern

- 1. Soil beneath the underground storage tanks may be impacted by fuel.
- 2. Potential media containing hazardous substances: soil and groundwater.
- 3. Chemical characteristics of wastes: diesel range compounds and BTEX.

V. Level of Protection

- <u>Level D</u> Level D is the basic work uniform. Protective equipment will include steel-toed work boots, work gloves, safety glasses, and a non-conductive hard hat.
- Level C personnel protective equipment will be donned when airborne concentrations of volatile organic compounds exceeds 10 parts per million (ppm) as measured on a field photoionization detector. The level C equipment will include the equipment required for level D protection and air purifying respirators with organic vapor cartridges.

VI. Control Boundaries

The site is fenced and additional temporary fence will be used to protect the public. Access by the public is restricted from the area. No foot traffic is anticipated in the work area. No unauthorized personnel will be allowed into the work area. The residence will not be occupied during site investigation activities and a limited number of W. A. Craig, Inc. employees will be active on the site.

VII. Site Security

The exclusion zone will be identified with yellow caution tape.

VIII. Emergency Response

A. Decontamination procedures for personnel injured or exposed in the work zone. Assist the injured or exposed worker out of the exclusion zone when possible. Toxicological hazards of BTEX, (including local and systemic health effects) in general:

- 1. **Benzene** = Breathing of high concentrations of benzene may cause acute poisoning, and death. Repeated inhalation of low concentration often results in severe or fatal anemia. Also an eye irritant.
- 2. **Toluene** = Eye and respiratory irritant. Extreme inhalation of vapors may cause death by paralysis of the respiratory center.
- 3. **Ethylbenzene** = Severely irritating to eyes in strong concentrations. As tolerance to irritation increases, dizziness becomes apparent. Also highly irritating to mucous membranes of the nose.
- 4. **Xylenes** = Toxic vapors in high concentration are anesthetic. Irritant to the skin and upper respiratory system.

X. PHYSICAL HAZARD ANALYSIS

Utilities – No aboveground and underground utilities that will interfere with the work at the site.

Heat Stress - Heat Stress caused by adverse climatic conditions should be considered. Signs of heat stress include physical discomfort, loss of efficiency, personal injury, and may increase the possibility of accidents. To reduce the effects of heat stress:

- Drink plenty of fluids or electrolyte containing drinks;
- Plan for work schedules that provide appropriate rest schedules; and
- Provide the employees with adequate training on the causes of heat stress and preventive measures.

Noise - Workers may be exposed to noise from the operation of equipment. Hearing protection will be used in high noise areas.

Slip, Trip, and Fall - Hazards such as potholes, nails, construction debris, etc. exist throughout the site. Boreholes or trenches will be properly secured to prevent falling injuries.

Striking Injuries - Hard hats are required to be worn at all times while in the work zone at the site. The hard hats must be worn properly and not be modified or altered in any way other than meets with the manufacturers specifications.

Eye Injuries - Eye protection must be worn to prevent eye injuries from chemical or physical hazards. Approved safety glasses with side shield will be worn at all times while on site.

Fire or Explosion - During excavation, potential fire and explosion hazards exist. It is not anticipated that lower explosive limit (LEL) will be a problem in the work area. Should it become necessary the site will be monitored using a PID meter to detect levels of airborne contamination in excess of 10-ppm (OSHA 8 hour TWA) work in the area will be halted and an assessment of worker and public safety will be assessed. Work will cease upon monitoring which indicates atmospheres above the lower explosive limit and appropriate mitigating measures will be performed. A minimum of two fire extinguishers will be located in readily accessible areas of the work area at all times.





During an inspection that was conducted on October 10, 1995, a representative of this office observed that these tanks were still on the property contrary to information we received from Mr. Chamkur on 8/18/93.

The inspection also revealed that your tanks are no longer in service. At least four of the tanks have cement poured over the fill ports. The one tank which was accessible had four inches of contaminated water inside. There were no plans mentioned or received which indicate these tanks have been serviced, monitored or maintained, since 8/18/93 or earlier.

Therefore, pursuant with the California Administrative Code (CAC), Title 23, Chapter 3, Subchapter 16 Underground Tank Regulations, you must perform one of the following actions;

the age and status of the tanks this may not be practical for your site. Consequently, the alternative is to remove the tanks from the ground.

Tank removal or closure-in-place requires the submission of a closure plan by a qualified and properly licensed contractor. You can initiate this process by notifying our department in writing of the date planned to remove your tanks. During the process you must keep our office informed of efforts to secure bids, hire a contractor and of scheduling the work to be performed.

UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK REMOVAL PROCESS IN ALAMEDA COUNTY

Dear Property Owner/Contractor:

The Alameda County, Environmental Protection Division, requires the following steps to be taken for the removal of underground storage tanks within its jurisdiction. Each step must be completed, and in the order shown, to ensure efficient review of your closure plan. The County's enforcement authority derives from Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), Chapter 6.7 of the Health and Safety Code, and a letter of agreement with the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board, and applies to underground storage tank removals within all parts of the county except for the cities of Berkeley, San Leandro, Hayward, Newark, Union City, Fremont, and Pleasanton. These cities administer their own underground storage tank programs and have their own requirements.

- 1. Obtain a blank Underground Tank Closure Plan from this office.
- 2. Complete the Underground Tank Closure Plan and attach the requested supporting documents (i.e., a site safety plan; a facility plot plan; copy of contractor's hazardous materials license; and a copy of the contractor's worker's compensation insurance certificate with the site address and certificate expiration date typed on it). Instructions for filling out the plan are attached to the blank plan.
- 3. Submit three copies of both the completed plan and the attachments to this office. A deposit must also be submitted at this time. The deposit, authorized by Section 3-141.6 of the Alameda County Ordinance Code, pays for the time spent by Hazardous Materials Specialists on the tank closure project. Deposit fee schedules are available at our office. Should the project be complex and time consuming, additional deposit money will be requested. Any unused deposit money will be refunded to the property owner or his/her designee at the close of the project.
- 4. We will review the Closure Plan within 30 days of plan receipt and contact you if there are deficiencies. Once the Plan is satisfactorily completed, we will stamp the plans and notify you. You may then pick up two copies of your stamped plan. We will retain the third copy for our files. All notes written on the plans by the project Specialist are conditions of plan acceptance and must be followed.

- 5. Present a copy of the stamped Closure Plan to the local fire department to obtain a permit. The local building department and the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (415-749-4990) should also be contacted concerning their permit requirements.
- 6. Our policy is to be present at all tank removals; contact the project Hazardous Materials Specialist at least three working days in advance to schedule the tank removal. If special arrangements are needed they must be worked out in advance with the project Hazardous Materials Specialist. All other permitting agencies' notification requirements must be met.
- 7. Have copies of all permits on site during the tank removal work.
- 8. Submit a Tank Closure Report to our office within 60 days of tank removal. The Closure Plan instructions outline the information and documents to be included in the Closure Report.

If sample analytical data or other evidence indicates the presence of any soil or groundwater contamination, you must file an Underground Storage Tank Unauthorized Release Report to this office within 5 working days of contamination discovery. Report forms are available in limited quantities from either this office or the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board in Oakland (510-286-1255). For large quantities of this form, contact the State Water Resources Control Board directly at 916-739-2421.

If contamination is discovered, our office should be contacted for detailed directions. The following is an overview of our general clean up requirements. All site clean up work must be performed according to the Tri-Regional Board Staff Recommendations for Preliminary Evaluation and Investigation of Underground Tank Sites. Any clean up work done without our concurrence is unacceptable.

- 1. Determine the horizontal and vertical extent of soil contamination both on and off site.
- Define the horizontal and vertical extent of any groundwater contamination, both on and off-site. This will include monitoring well construction and regular groundwater sampling.
- 3. Interpret hydrogeologic data, including characterization of the appropriate aquifer(s).
- 4. If groundwater is contaminated, determine the type of beneficial uses of the groundwater. The San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board Water Quality Control Plan (Basin Plan) has defined all Bay Area water as having beneficial uses. However the types of beneficial uses vary and must be determined in order to establish appropriate cleanup levels (State Water Resources Control Board Sources of Drinking Water Policy, #88-63).

5. Develop a site-specific remediation plan. This plan shall include an evaluation of cleanup alternatives, a proposal for soil cleanup, a proposal for clean up of any groundwater contamination and free product, an appropriate sampling plan to determine the effectiveness of the cleanup program, and a time table for remediation plan implementation.

After the remediation program is completed and the final report is submitted, this office will review the case. If appropriate, this office will submit the case to the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board for final site mitigation approval and case closure. Failure to provide proper documentation of all site cleanup work could result in the requirement to conduct properly documented additional work.
