Dear Mr. Elliott:

I am in receipt of your letter dated May 6, 1993 and the Soil Remediation Progress Report prepared by AllWest Environmental Company dated April 30, 1993 regarding the hydraulic hoist removal at the above referenced facility. I have reviewed this report and concur with the recommendations with the following conditions:

- During the hydropunch or temporary well method construction at pit T-3/T-4, another soil sample is to be collected at the point of highest concentration previously noted (22000 ppm) and analyzed for the Toxicity Characteristic Leaching Procedure (TCLP) with a modified pH of rain water.
- The four quarter groundwater sampling program with the installation of a down-gradient monitoring well is to be changed to a four semi-annual sampling program over two years.
- Any future work to be done at the site is to be pre-scheduled with 48 hours notice to this department for inspection availability (please note that the previous work was also supposed to have been overseen by this department).
