NOTICE OF VIOLATION

Dear Mr. Chan:

As you're aware, every California business that handles hazardous materials and wastes in excess of specified thresholds must file a business plan according to the provisions of Chapter 6.95 of the California Health and Safety Code. The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials Division, is the implementing agency for business plans in Alameda County. On March 10, 1989, Gil Wistar of my staff notified you by telephone that Dublin Multilayer had not submitted a hazardous materials/wastes inventory as required by state law. At that time, you stated that this information would be submitted by March 24. Soon afterwards, Steve Frank of EMA Consultants contacted Mr. Wistar, indicating that he was preparing the inventory and that he'd send it to this office by the first week of April 1989. As of the date of this letter, we have not received the required hazardous material and hazardous waste inventories.

Please submit your chemical inventory to this office as soon as possible, but not later than June 23, 1989, to complete your business plan filing. According to Sec. 25514(b) of the California Health and Safety Code, any company that fails to provide any part of a business plan after being given reasonable notice is liable for a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 for every day in which the violation continues.

*** NOTICE OF VIOLATION ***

Dear Mr. Chan:

On July 19, 1987, a spill of water and sludge mixture from a waste water treatment system at your facility occurred. The spilled material also went off-site into a nearby storm drain.

A sample of this material was taken by Lowell Miller and analysis indicated that total chromium, copper and lead levels exceeded the Total Threshold Limit Concentration (TTLC) listed in Title 22 of the California Administrative Code (CAC). This is a violation of the California Health and Safety Code, Chapter 6.5, Section 25189.5.

According to Mr. Karl Santer, Quality Control Manager of Dublin Multilayer, Inc., the spilled material in the parking lot area was cleaned up on July 19, 1987 by Erickson, Inc. However, our file shows no documentation regarding the extent of contamination that occurred in the storm drain and what measures have been taken to clean up this area.

In accordance with CAC, Title 22, Division 4, Chapter 30, Sec. 66328, a Plan of Correction must be submitted to this office within 30 days of the receipt of this letter. The plan should specify the actions to be taken to address the above violation and expected dates of completion. It is recommended that you expedite clean up of the storm drain in order to minimize further contamination should wet weather occur.

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Your attention is directed to Sections 25184, 25189 and 25191 of the California Health and Safety Code which provides for civil and criminal penalties of up to \$25,000 per day, per violation for violation of its regulations.

Dear Mr. Sauter:

On April 28, 1986, an inspection of the above subject facility disclosed the following:

1. The 55 gallon drums of hazardous waste, sludge from the pretreatment plant were not labeled as required in sec 66504(c), Title 22, California Administrative Code.
2. Each of the drums were not labeled with the date accumulation began, as required by sec 66508(2), Title 22, California Administrative Code.
3. There was no berm around the Haz waste storage area, as required by sec 67245, Title 22, California Administrative Code.
4. The 23 to 25 drums of hazardous waste were not secured inside a building or fence with signs in both English and Spanish "Danger - Hazardous Waste Area-Unauthorized Personnel Keep Out", as required by sec 67103, Title 22, California Administrative Code.

Section 66328(d), Title 22, California Administrative Code states that, if corrections are needed, the operator shall provide to the department, a written plan of correction, which states the actions to be taken and the expected dates of completion. Pursuant to this section, we request that you submit a plan of correction to this office within 15 days.
