Dear Mr. Goldenberg:

This letter is in response to your letter dated November 19th, 1990 to this office explaining your position with respect to the remediation at the above site.

In response to your initial comment regarding the 60 day comment curfew after which you can assume no further action is required by this department or the Regional Water Board. It has never been the policy of either department to endorse this sort of policy. conversation with Larry Seto he stated that he had no such understanding with you.

After conferring with Steve LuQuire of the Regional Water Quality Control Board, with consideration given to the geographic location and the levels of contamination at the site you are required to implement one of the following options:

Continue to over excavate the remaining contamination on the above site and confirm that all contaminated soil has been removed by soil sampling and chemical analysis which would indicate a nondetectable (ND) value for the presence of Total Oil and Grease.

Install monitoring wells which would measure the potential impact to groundwater from the contamination which had occurred at this site and provide information to this office regarding the contamination remaining in the ground at this site. Information needed in quarterly monitoring reports includes the quality of groundwater, depth to groundwater and hydraulic gradient. Soil boring logs indicating soil type and amounts of contamination are also requested to be provided to this office if/when monitoring wells are installed. Per your request for a statement covering the expenditure of the previous deposit, please find the attached statement. You are requested to submit an additional \$300.00 to cover future expenses incurred by this department on the over sight of the remediation effort at the above site.

You are required to submit a proposal which would address your plan to implement either of the above options within 30 days of the receipt of this letter.

Dear Mr. Goldenberg:

This letter informs you that Mr. Larry Seto no longer carries responsibility for the above site and that I will be your contact person handling this site from this date forward.

In reviewing your case it appears that, with the absence of other correspondence or reports that you may still be awaiting a response to your earlier letter dated March 16, 1989. This letter requested a waiver of the requirement for the installation of a groundwater monitoring well at the above location.

Summarizing the findings to date, the initial laboratory results obtained by composite sampling revealed levels of Total Oil And Grease (TOG) (using method 503E) of 1400 ppm. Following excavation at several points, confirmatory sampling still encountered levels of TOG between 155 and 445 ppm. With these levels in mind, it appears that several elements to this site investigation have not been either fully or adequately addressed.

In light of you failure to fully identify the lateral and vertical extent of subsurface soil contamination, this department considers your request for variance from standard groundwater evaluation procedures to be premature.

You are requested to submit a plan which addresses the proposed method for remediation of soil and which will investigate whether groundwater has been impacted at the above site.

Pursuant to the Tri-Regional Recommendations (August 1990) this office requests the installation of at least one monitoring well in the established down gradient direction.

You are requested to submit a proposal for the removal of contaminated soil and for the installation of monitoring wells which at a minimum is to include the following information:

1) Adequately address the soil contamination at this site.

- 2) A map depicting the proposed location of the groundwater monitoring wells relative to the contaminated or previously contaminated areas.
- 3) A rationale for the selection of the proposed well locations.
- 4) A proposed schedule for the installation of monitoring wells, soil treatment or removal, sampling events and quarterly monitoring reports
- 5) A list of chemical analysis to be performed. Analysis for Total Oil and Grease, Benzene, Toluene, Xylene, and Ethylbenzene (BTEX), Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons (TPH) for gas and diesel is recommended.
- 6) You are requested to provide to this department copies of the manifests for soil which has been or will be transported off-site. To date no documentation of the disposition of soil removed from this site is available in earlier reports.

Finally, a review of our records indicates that the balance of the deposit submitted when this department became involved in the surface contamination at the above location is nearly depleted and therefore insufficient to cover remaining costs anticipated for this project. Please submit to this office a check made payable to the County of Alameda for \$300.00

This deposit is authorized by Section 3-141.6 of the Ordinance Code of the County of Alameda and is used to cover expanses incurred by Alameda County personnel in the discharge of their duties associated with this project. The deposit is charged at an hourly rate. Upon the completion of the project the unused portion of the balance will be returned to you.

You are requested to submit the items specified above within 30 days of the receipt of this letter.
