Dear Ms. Duerig:

In accordance with Section 13267(b) of the California Water Code, 6000 S Corporation is hereby reporting on actions taken during the period of July 1, 1991 thru September 30, 1991 regarding environmental issues at the 6000 Stevenson Blvd. site.

There are three remaining environmental issues at the 6000 Stevenson site that have not yet been fully remedied.

- o The Foundry Sand issue has been put before the courts. Several settlement meetings have been held at Superior Court. As of this date, the depositor of the Foundry Sand, American Brass & Iron, and Alameda County Department of Health officials are in negotiations on removal of the material. A mid-October settlement conference has been delayed pending outcome of these negotiations.
- o The contaminated soil issue is continuing as scheduled. The material has been stockpiled on plastic sheeting. It is being watered and tilled three times a week. Testing of this material for oil and grease, diesel and PCB's will be done in November of this year. Test results will be submitted to the appropriate agency for review for removal.

o The final remaining issue of monitoring ground water was discussed at the site this past week with Ms. Duerig of Alameda County Water District. Two new water monitoring wells were requested. Three consultants have been contacted to provide costs for the installation of the new wells. With the addition of these two wells, six monitoring wells are now available for testing.

The company has contacted several consultants to review testing requirements for the six monitoring wells. Upon completion of the new wells, the company will contract with a testing laboratory or consulting geologist to perform quarterly testing and reporting of the monitoring wells to the lead agency.

6000 S Corporation was unexpectedly contacted this quarter by The Bechtel Corporation, who was under contract to the Environmental Protection Agency, to inspect this site as a possible superfund candidate. We have been informed by Bechtel that the results of their recommendations would be made available to us upon completion.

If this site is a true superfund candidate, it seems the policies and thrust of the E.P.A. really do need major revision as indicated by recent public opinion.
