Mr. Larry Seto of the Alameda County Health Department recommended that I write to you regarding obtaining a closure letter for a piece of property located at 1466 36th Avenue, Oakland, California. I am a Trustee of August Manufacturing which has owned the property since 1957. We are currently in the process of selling this property.

In 1989, the County Health Department asked us to perform a groundwater investigation based on test results from samples taken at two underground tank sites (the tanks were removed in the 1950's). No gasoline or diesel were detected at that time, however, some metals and cyanide were found. Since that time, we have had our consultants drill three wells and take soil and groundwater samples. Harding Lawson Associates has most recently been sampling the wells for over a year. A copy of their last report is attached pp. U5 to this letter.

According to their results, only very low levels of chemicals have been detected. We have not handled or used any of the solvents found, and the soil samples taken from the vicinity of the tanks were clean.

August Manufacturing has spent a considerable amount of time and money on this work performed, and we have cooperated fully with the County. Manufacturing did not cause the contamination, and we should not have to spend any additional time and money on more samplings or investigations. Lawson Associates has stated because of the very low levels of chemicals found that will dissipate in time and the type of land use in the area, the groundwater will not require remediation.

We would like a letter from the Water Board stating that we are not required to do any additional testing and that we can close the wells. This letter would be used to provide the documentation required by the buyers.

Dear Mr. Duffy:

As per our meeting on August 29, 1990 with your consultant, Mr. Michael Siembieda of Harding Lawson Assoc., your subsurface investigation workplan dated August 27, 1990, is acceptable with the following provisions:

- A soil sample must be collected every 5' from each of the two well boring.
- 2) A minimum of one sample must be tested from each boring.
- 3) All work must be done in accordance to Guidelines and Regulations of the San Francisco Bay, Regional Water Quality Control Board under the direction of this office.
- 4) If the "Total Organic Compound" in soil samples taken on March 23, 1990, is not identified in this round of sampling, further investigation, including additional soil borings maybe required.
