Dear Mr. Palmer:

This Department has received and reviewed your proposal for the subject site. The work includes the over-excavation and removal of soil in the area of the former sump and the installation of three ground water monitoring wells.

We concur with the intent of the work plan. However, the following issues require clarification prior to the commencement of work.

- 1. Provide an estimate of the maximum volume of soil to be sampled at each interval in the over-excavation of the former sump. One discrete sample for every 20 cubic yards will be acceptable to this office.
- 2. Only two sampling events are proposed for the ground water investigation. This office may require additional monitoring and subsurface investigation if results from the two sampling events are positive for contaminants of concern. Defining the site specific ground water gradient from only two events, spaced in time by sixty days, will not be conclusive.
- 3. Soils excavated prior to confirmatory sampling are not being analyzed for priority metals. Please describe the actions to be taken if confirmatory sampling is positive for priority metals.
- 4. A site safety plan was not included in the proposed work plan. Please provide such a plan for the site activities described in the proposal.

5. Provide additional monies for this Department's oversight of the project. The account will be debited for time dedicated to the site specific activities. The current estimate of time involved in the on-going project is three hours, (three hours @ \$75.00 = \$225.00).

Dear Mr. Katz:

This Department has received and reviewed the Subsurface Investigation Summary Report, September 1992, written by Metcalf and Eddy (M&E) for the subject site, prepared for Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company, 1144 E. Market Street, Akron, OH. The purpose of your field investigation was to provide initial data for the site evaluation. The report identified levels of hydrocarbon and volatile halocarbon soil contamination in excess of regulatory thresholds and as a potential source of contamination to groundwater.

It is required that further and complete characterization of the subject site be undertaken to define the horizontal and vertical extent of soil and groundwater contamination. The information gathered from the temporary well points is of limited value in defining groundwater elevation data and the site specific gradient. However, the data does confirm that groundwater quality has been impacted on the site.

The further investigation will include but is not limited to a determination of contaminates of concern in both soil and groundwater. The plan should include the installation of groundwater monitoring well(s) to define the site specific gradient and a quantitative sampling plan for monitoring the groundwater.

Submit to this office, within 45 days of this letter, a remedial action plan that addresses the elements discussed as well as a risk management plan. The risk management plan should be in the form of a risk assessment, a remediation plan or long term monitoring proposal to address the site contamination problem. Concurrence with the plan by this Department is required prior to commencement of site activities.

Gentlemen:

This office has received and reviewed documents submitted on December 18, 1991, by PES Environmental, Inc., a consulting firm retained by A & A Properties. Upon reviewing the information submitted, the following steps are required by this office for a proper investigation.

- 1) It will be necessary to submit a workplan that will adequately identify the vertical and horizontal extent of contamination. This should be undertaken by utilizing practices as outlined in either the Tri-Regional Board Staff Recommendations For Preliminary Evaluation and Investigation of Underground Tanks" (enclosed), or the LUFT Manual, promulgated by the State Water Quality Control Board.
- 2) Provide this office and the State Regional Water Quality Control Board with copies of the workplans indicating appropriate steps to be taken in order to investigate the site. The workplan should be submitted by January 20, 1992.
- 3) Complete an "Unauthorized Release (Leak)
 Contamination Site Report", (enclosed). This will
 satisfy the State requirement for reporting potential
 releases to the environment.

- 4) Develop a remediation plan. The overall effectiveness of the remediation system should be verified by appropriate monitoring program.
- 5) Submit a time schedule for this investigation/ remediation project. Estimated date of completion for the clean-up of contaminants at the site must be included.

All reports and proposals must be submitted under seal of a California Registered Geologist or Registered Civil Engineer.

Please be advised that this is a formal request for technical reports pursuant to California Water Code Section 13267 (b). Failure to respond could result in civil penalties, a maximum of \$1.000 per day. Any extensions of stated deadlines or changes in the workplan must be confirmed in writing and approved by this office or the Regional Water Quality Control Board.
