I told him an industrial hygienist ~~was~~ would be able to fit test the workers & that an industrial hygienist could probably be found in the phone book. Bob asked if the respirator supplier could fit test the workers. I told Bob it depended upon the supplier's capabilities as to whether they could fit test people. I explained to Bob that respirators must be fitted to the individual like any piece of clothing - different people wear different sizes.
