Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanups (SLIC) case file for the above-referenced site, including recently submitted correspondence dated September 5, 2007 and a report entitled, "F & F Grinding Environmental Site Assessment, 510 Derby Avenue, Oakland, CA," dated January 30, 1995 and received by ACEH on September 17, 2007. The September 5, 2007 correspondence responds to ACEH technical comments regarding the source of ammonia in soil samples collected beneath the building, potential human health risks from ammonia, and land use restrictions. The report entitled, "F & F Grinding Environmental Site Assessment, 510 Derby Avenue, Oakland, CA," dated January 30, 1995 presents the results of an environmental audit conducted to identify potential contamination or other environmental problems. The information contained in the 1995 report would have been more useful if provided in the work plan phase of investigation rather than following site investigation activities. We have several technical comments related to site features and information provided in the 1995 report.

We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work, and send us the Response to Agency comments requested below.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

1. Site Features Shown on Figures. We note that the building outline shown on Figure 2 of the report entitled, "Subsurface Investigation," dated January 29, 2007 differs from the building outline shown in section 2.2 of the January 30, 1995 Environmental Site Assessment report (see attached Site Plans A and B). The building appears rectangular on Site Plan A (1995 report) but appears square on Site Plan B (2007 report); however, no scale is included on Site Plan A. Please compare the two figures and describe the reason for the differences in the Response to Agency Comments requested below. Specifically, is

the portion of the building labeled "Small Grinding Machines and Waste Oil Storage," shown on Site Plan A (1995 report) included on Site Plan B (2007 report) and was this area of the building investigated? We request that you prepare a revised Site Plan B to show this portion of the building.

- 2. Old Oil Quenching Area. A feature described as an "Old Oil Quenching Area," is shown on Site Plan A (1995 report). Please show this feature on a revised Site Plan B and indicate whether this feature was investigated in the Response to Agency Comments requested below.
- 3. Tanks for Grinding Machines. Section 5.7 of the 1995 report describes in-ground tanks containing coolant for grinding machines #3 and #4. The liquid level in tank #4 was described as rising following heavy periods of rain, indicating potential leakage. Please provide further information on the size of these tanks and how they were decommissioned. We also request that you show these tanks on a revised Site Plan and indicate whether these features were investigated in the Response to Agency Comments requested below.





Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanups (SLIC) case file for the above-referenced site, which includes the report entitled, "Subsurface Investigation, Voila Juices, 510 Derby Avenue, Oakland, CA," dated January 29, 2007 and received by ACEH on March 15, 2007. The report presents results from soil sampling conducted in four shallow soil borings. TPH as motor oil was detected in one of five soil samples collected at a concentration of 240 mg/kg, which exceeds the California Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) Environmental Screening Level (ESL) for residential land use. Cyanide was detected in one soil sample at a concentration of 0.76 mg/kg. Ammonia was detected in two of four soil samples collected at concentrations of 15 and 580 mg/kg, respectively. The report indicates that there are no ESLs or EPA Region 9 Preliminary Remediation Goals for ammonia for screening purposes. The report also does not discuss potential human health risks due to ammonia in soils (see technical comment 2 below).

We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work, and send us the Response to Agency comments requested below.

REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

ACEH's case files for the subject site contain only the reports entitled, "Subsurface Investigation Report," dated June 30, 2004, Site Investigation Work Plan," dated November 8, 2006, and "Subsurface Investigation," dated January 29, 2007. We request that you submit copies of any other reports you have documenting additional investigation activities or other relevant work related to this site. Specifically, we request that you submit to ACEH a copy of any Phase I Environmental Assessment reports completed for the site as part of property transactions. The Subsurface Investigation Report," dated June 30, 2004 includes an appendix entitled, Historical Survey Data; however, scope of the historical review is limited.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

- 1. Source of Ammonia. There is no discussion of the potential source of ammonia detected in soil at the site. Please indicate in the Response to Comments requested below whether ammonia is stored or used at the site. Specifically, please indicate whether ammonia is used as a refrigerant in any refrigeration systems on site and whether there is a potential for re-occurring ammonia leaks from any source on site.
- 2. Potential Human Health Risks from Ammonia. The Subsurface Investigation Report concludes that no contaminant concentrations exceeded their respective ESLs although there are no ESLs for ammonia. The report recommends no further action for the site based on the results presented. Please discuss in the Response to Comments requested below, the basis for concluding that the ammonia detected in soil does not pose a potential human health risk.
- 3. Land Use Restriction. The information requested in the Response to Comments will be reviewed in order to provide further direction for the site or to concur with the request for no further action. Please note that if no remedial actions are conducted at the site, a deed restriction will be required for the property due to the residual contamination remaining in soil. The deed restriction will require ACEH notification and review if a land use change from the current commercial use to a more conservative land use such as residential use is proposed.

In order for Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) to review Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanups (SLIC) cases, we require an oversight account. Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanups (SLIC) case file for the above-referenced site and the document entitled, "Site Investigation Work Plan, Former F&F Grinding, 510 Derby Avenue, Oakland, CA," dated November 8, 2006, prepared for Voila Juices by Professional Service Industries, Inc. The Work Plan proposes advancing four soil borings to five feet bgs in areas where chemical releases potentially may have occurred. The proposed scope of work is acceptable provided that the items identified in the technical comments below are addressed and incorporated during the field investigation. Submittal of a revised Work Plan is not required provided that the technical comments are fully addressed during the field investigation.

We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work, and send us the technical reports requested below.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

- Soil Sampling. The Work Plan proposes the collection of soil samples from depths of one feet and five feet bgs. We request that soil samples be continuously screened and logged during advancement of the hand auger borings. In addition to collection of soil samples for laboratory analysis at fixed depths of one and five feet bgs, soil samples are to be submitted for laboratory analyses for all depth intervals where staining, odor, or elevated PID readings are observed. Please include results in the Soil Investigation Report requested below.
- Laboratory Anaylsis. The proposed laboratory analyses for metals, total petroleum hydrocarbons, and volatile organic compounds on the soil samples are generally acceptable. However, we request that total cyanide analysis by EPA Method 335.2 also be

performed on the soil samples. Due to the observation of a strong ammonia odor within the interval immediately below the concrete slab in boring B-5, we request that nitrogen/ammonia analyses be conducted on the soil samples also. Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanups (SLIC) case file for the above-referenced site, which includes the report entitled, "Site Investigation Report, 510 Derby Avenue and Ford Street, Oakland, CA," dated August 13, 2004, prepared for Voila Juices by Professional Service Industries, Inc. The report identified four areas of concern at the site: two concrete sumps that contained a viscous sludge that appeared to be petroleum hydrocarbons and metals and two areas of stacked drums. A site investigation conducted on June 8, 2004 included the collection of four shallow groundwater samples in the areas of concern. Total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) as diesel, TPH as motor oil, metals, volatile organic compounds, and semi-volatile organic compounds were detected in the groundwater samples. Cobalt and nickel were detected in groundwater at concentrations exceeding Regional Water Quality Control Board Environmental Screening Levels (ESLs). No soil or soil vapor samples were collected during the investigation.

The site investigation did not evaluate whether residual contamination is present in soil beneath the building. Investigation of shallow soil is required to assess whether shallow soils beneath the building have been impacted by previous site activities. Therefore, we request that you submit a Work Plan by November 30, 2006 to investigate shallow soil conditions beneath the building.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

1. Soil Boring Logs. The Site Investigation report indicates that soil borings were logged according to the Unified Soil Classification System. However, no soil boring logs were presented in the report. Submittal of soil boring logs is a standard industry practice. We request that you submit the soil boring logs from the site investigation in the Work Plan requested below.

TECHNICAL REPORT REQUEST
