RE: 4133 MacArthur Blvd (corner of High and MacArthur, previous Roberts Tire and former gas station) Cortese list, groundwater contamination

Thank you for the link but it doesn't have any reports for that particular site that I can find. It shows Roberts tires on the map, but when I request a report, nothing is generated.

Will the county be following up on this groundwater concern? It appears that the City of Oakland may likely ignore it; in the draft EIR focus they specifically say that they will not be addressing any soil or groundwater issues, that the EIR will only address things like traffic.

They mention that the property is on the Cortese list, but do not indicate any consideration of delaying project approval based on soils contamination.

What is the county going to do about this site? Will the property owner be allowed to cover the property with a groundfloor parking structure and not be required to address the underground tanks? What about test wells? Since the state listing shows that the lead soil contamination was cleared, this was used by the City a few years ago to approve the project by claiming it had CEQA exemption.
