Dear Mr. Wickham:

The City of Livermore is in receipt of your letter dated December 15, 2015, regarding the review of the Interim Remedial Action Plan for 2259 First Street, Livermore, CA, prepared under the direction of Chevron dated November 19, 2015. We appreciate your thorough review and response to the Interim Remedial Action Plan.

The City of Livermore fully supports and concurs with the requirements outlined in your response letter. The County's letter correctly identifies that the Interim Remedial Action Plan fails to provide definitive plans for the remediation, makes gross assumptions as to the source of contamination, and incorrectly assumes the City of Livermore will complete the soil remediation work as part of the planned park renovation. The Remedial Action Plan should address the fact that a gas station operated on this site for decades, which is the most likely source of the lead contamination.

We are again requesting that Chevron comply with the Alameda County Health Services' directive to complete the Remedial Action Plan and remediate the site prior to the City's Livermorium Park/Plaza project. As part of the Remedial Action Plan, the City requests Chevron be required to provide a data pack including chains of custody, field of reagent blanks, site map and data. A continued delay on Chevron's part to complete the required remediation denies the City the opportunity to proceed with the redevelopment of this Park/Plaza unimpeded.

We look forward to the required Revised Interim Remedial Action Plan on January 14, 2016.
