After reviewing your grant application to the Orphan Site Cleanup Account (OSCA) for the site located at 3701 Martin Luther King Jr. Way, Oakland ,we find that the following additional information is needed to determine your eligibility for placement on the OSCA Priority List:

REGULATORY CONFIRMATION OF A PETROLEUM UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK (UST) RELEASE AND DIRECTIVE

Health and Safety Code section 25299.50.2 authorizes the use of OSCA funds at sites that meet certain criteria. The State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) adopted regulations that implement section 25299.50.2. These regulations became effective on July 25, 2006 and are found at Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations, Division 3, Chapter 18, Article 7 (OSCA regulations).

To receive OSCA funds, an applicant must demonstrate, among other things, that the regulatory agency responsible for overseeing response actions at the eligible site directs or approves response actions subject to an unauthorized release of petroleum from a UST or response actions are required as part of the site development process. Response actions taken must be necessary to protect human health, safety and the environment and are performed in accordance with applicable laws, including Health and Safety Code, division 20, chapter 6.7 and California Code of Regulations, title 23, division 3, chapter 16, and Water Code, division 7.

- 1. Provide documentation (a copy of the Unauthorized Leak Release Report filed with the local regulatory agency) of a confirmed petroleum UST release.
- 2. Provide documentation that the regulatory agency is directing or approving response actions or that response actions taken are part of the site development process.
