Dear Chief Withers:

The attached draft format for an agreement is offered as a method for requesting the county to assume the responsibility of implementing the underground tank program in the city of Pleasanton.

Section 25283(a) chap. 6.7 Div. 20 Health and Safety Code mandates that every county shall implement the Underground Storage of Hazardous Substances Law. A city by ordinance may assume this responsibility. Therefore if requested the Alameda County Environmental Health Department, Hazardous Materials Division has the ability to assume the responsibility and implement the Underground Storage of Hazardous Substances Law for the City of Pleasanton.

The counties program would include routine inspections of all underground tanks as required by title 23, California Code of Regulations. These inspections would be held at the same time as other hazardous materials program inspections thereby lessening the time needed which impacts the local business. If desired we could coordinate your 2185 inspection at the same time.

Also we will have as the implementing agency the ability to oversee site remediations where soil and or groundwater have been contaminated. This could include if agreed to by the city all sites of contamination whether by underground fuel tank leaks or other sources of contamination.

Our fees would be the same countywide where we are the implementing agency and we would collect and send to the state their 5 year surcharge (attachment A). Since our fee for service is paid by the recipient of the service there will be no cost to the City for operating the program.

When the agreement is signed by both parties, we can obtain from you a list of all the permitted tanks in Pleasanton and start our billing cycle prorated based on the annual anniversary of the 5 year surcharge required to be sent to the State.

The county is as always ready to assist the cities in any way possible and we look forward to a continuing cooperative working relationship.

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF PLEASANTON
AND THE COUNTY OF ALAMEDA ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT
FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE UNDERGROUND STORAGE OF HAZARDOUS
MATERIALS**

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into on the _____ day of _____, 19__ between the City of Pleasanton and the Alameda County Health Care Services Agency, Department of Environmental Health through its duly authorized representative, the President of the Board of Supervisors of Alameda County.

A. RECITALS AND PURPOSES

1. The City of Pleasanton by ordinance assumed responsibility for the implementation of chapter 6.7 div. 20 Health and Safety Code in 19__ pursuant to sec. 25283(a).
2. Implementation of this chapter includes inspections to verify that the tanks are in compliance with all federal, state and local laws and regulations. Issuing permits and collecting state surcharge and fees for service.
3. The City of Pleasanton is a municipal corporation of the State of California with the authority to implement or enact an agreement for the services to implement the Underground Storage of Hazardous Materials Law and Regulations.

B. SCOPE OF WORK

1. The County Department of Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials Division will inspect all underground tanks in the City of Pleasanton for conformity to the requirements of chapter 6.7, Division 20, California Health and Safety Code.
2. The County Department of Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials Division will oversee all site remediation of soil and or groundwater contamination, per our delegation by the Regional Water Quality Control Board and the State Water Resources Control Board, from identification of contamination through the final sign off by the Regional Water Quality Control Board for the City of Pleasanton.

The above programs will be implemented at no cost to the City of Pleasanton.
