Good Morning Mr. Wickham,

I recently received your response letter, dated October 10, 2007. Thank you for the timely reply. I will begin preparing the CAP as you requested shortly. Mechanical excavation of contaminated soil is one mitigation approach they we are almost certainly going to employ. One thing to keep in mind is that we may not be able to excavate the whole bulk of contaminated soil, as we do not want to undermine the integrity of the building by getting too close to the footings.

My client, Mr. and Ms. Allen, are eager to commence excavation immediately, if possible. Concerning this excavation, is it ok if I send you a site plan before the preparation of the CAP, illustrating the horizontal and vertical extent of excavation? Or would you rather we include all of this in the upcoming CAP report instead. Hope all is well. Thank you.
