## PUBLIC NOTIFICATION OF POTENTIAL CLOSURE OF FUEL LEAK CASE 925 Stanford Avenue, Oakland August 29, 2011

Summary – This fact sheet has been prepared to inform community members and other interested parties of potential case closure for a fuel leak case at 925 Stanford Ave. in Oakland, California. Site investigation and cleanup activities have been completed by the Wilbett Company and it does not appear that the fuel release presents a risk to

human health based upon the current industrial land use as a burner manufacturing company. Two underground storage tanks and one above-ground storage tanks formerly containing heating oil were removed in 2008. Subsequent investigations and groundwater sampling indicates that petroleum hydrocarbon concentrations in groundwater appear to not pose a risk to workers at the site or at surrounding buildings.




Background - The site is occupied by S.T. Johnson, an industrial and commercial burner manufacturing company located in a commercial district. Three heating oil tanks (2 USTs and one AST) have been removed from the site, and a series of site investigations have been performed. actions including removing three feet of soil from beneath the USTs and dewatering approximately 1,300 gallons from the tank pit. No significant contaminants were detected near the AST. Four soil borings were advanced to determine the extent of petroleum hydrocarbons from the USTs. No volatile organic hydrocarbons were detected in soil or groundwater. Groundwater sampling indicates that the concentrations of petroleum hydrocarbons in groundwater beneath the site do not appear to pose a risk to the public at the site or at surrounding properties.

Next Step - The public is invited to review and comment on the potential closure of the fuel leak case.
