Thank you for taking the time to answer my questions by telephone yesterday morning concerning your office's letter dated July 12, 2010.

## PERTINENT INFORMATION:

I have owned the parcel at 6562 Shattuck Ave., Oakland, CA 94609 since June of 1983. I was advised that the facility had last been used as a small local gas station prior to 1981. From the time of my ownership, the facility was never used as a gas station and the three underground storage tanks on the property remained empty up to the time they were removed in May of 1985. Upon receiving notification in 1984 from the State Water Resources Control Board concerning registering unused or abandoned tanks and a letter from the Oakland Fire Department concerning the hazards of unused or abandoned tanks, I made the decision to have the tanks professionally removed from the property. After interviewing more than one company, I hired the Walker's Hydraulies Company in May of 1985 to excavate and remove the tanks with the specific requirement to fulfill all current laws, regulations and procedures concerning documentation, inspection and safety. This involved working with the Oakland Fire Department, represented by Mr. Gordon Gullett who was on-site during the excavation, notifying the Regional Water Resources Control Board and following the directives of Mr. Dale Bowyer and Mr. Peter Johnson, both representatives of the Board. In addition, Trevor Pitt of Zero Waste Systems, was hired to obtain site samples from the excavation, provide the proper documentation and deliver samples to and obtain soil sample laboratory results from Brown And Caldwell Analytical Laboratories, James Hatfield Laboratory Director. Once the Brown And Calwell lab results were available and reviewed by Mr. Peter Johnson of

the Regional Water Resources Control Board, he approved the results and allowed The Walker's Hydraulics Company to refill the excavation and cover the surface with a concrete slab.

In terms of the reference in your letter of July 12 that the status of the underground storage tanks remains "open" and that your office interprets this as implying that "a potential unauthorized release may have occurred", I wish to state emphatically that during my ownership of the property, which amounts to 27 years, there has never occurred an unauthorized release of fuel or any other contaminant on the property. Also, since 1994 the property has been used exclusively as a retail plant nursery.
