It is acceptable to ACEH to incorporate MIP into the soil and groundwater investigation. ACEH believes the use of MIP is advantageous as a tool providing information for the relative distribution of the contaminants provided the investigation is performed by qualified professionals in the use of MIP. However, as the MIP does not provide quantitative data, soil and groundwater sampling still needs to be conducted within the confines of the site.

ACEH looks forward to reviewing the investigation work plan for the subject fuel leak case. Please let me know if you will require an extension to the work plan submittal date of July 31, 2014.
