ACC, on behalf of Rush Property Group, previously submitted an access agreement to you to allow the installation of a groundwater monitoring well at 1549 32nd Street, Oakland. It is imperative that this access agreement be resolved in order to define the extent of contamination and prevent future contaminant migration.

Owners of adjacent properties are generally not responsible for the cost of investigation and cleanup of contamination that migrates onto their property from an adjacent fuel leak site.
