Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) has completed review of the Building 12 Vapor Mitigation System, Construction Completion Report, Locale @ State Street, Fremont, California, dated June 12, 2018, prepared by PES Environmental, Inc. on behalf of Fremont State Street Center, LLC. This report documents completion of the installation of the vapor mitigation engineering controls (VMEC) for Building 12 of the subject development and post VMEC installation indoor air testing verifying that the VMECs are effectively mitigating the potential vapor intrusion risk from volatile organic compounds in soil vapor to indoor air in Building 12. Based on ACDEH's review of this document, and with the provision that the information provided to this agency is accurate and representative of site conditions, no further remedial action or monitoring is required prior to occupancy of Building 12.

Therefore, at this juncture ACDEH has no objection to the City of Fremont approving Building 12 for residential occupancy provided post-closure maintenance, monitoring and reporting activities are conducted in accordance with the following documents:

- Vapor Mitigation System, Trench Dams and Trench Plugs, Operations and Maintenance Plan, Locale @ State Street, Fremont, California, dated February 28, 2018, by PES Environmental, Inc.: and
- Covenant and Environmental Restriction on Property, Locale at State Street, Fremont, California, Land Use Covenant (LUC) recorded on March 2, 2018.

This letter provides clearance for occupancy for Building 12 of the subject development only. Installation of VMEC and indoor air testing is required prior to ACDEH providing clearance for occupancy of the other buildings in the subject development.

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the State Water Board's (SWB) GeoTracker website in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Chapter 30, Division3, Title 23 and Division 3, Title 27.

Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.
